Report of the Head of Legal Services

1. **LICENSING (2003 ACT)** **TRANSITIONAL PREMISES LICENCE APPLICATIONS –** **ST. IVES INN, NEATH**

The Sub Committee was asked to consider the undermentioned licence applications for both conversion and variation of a Transitional Premises Licence for the above mentioned premises.

The applicant, Ms. Rees and her business associate, Mr.L.Davies, attended the meeting in support of the applications.

(a) **Conversion Application**

The Sub Committee was informed that, as the premises had traded as a Public House for many years, the applicants would be entitled to a premises licence for the sale of alcohol with the previous permitted hours becoming conditions of the new Licence.

However, this conversion application would then be superseded by the variation application submitted, if granted.
