### **Report of the Head of Legal Services**

1. **LICENSING (2003) ACT - TRANSITIONAL PREMISES LICENCE  
APPLICATIONS – BAR METRO AND SIGNALS NIGHTCLUB, 11  
COMMERCIAL STREET, NEATH**

The Sub Committee was asked to consider the licence applications for both conversion and variation of a Transitional Premises Licence for the above mentioned premises.

The applicant, Deborah Elizabeth Richards, attended the meeting in support of the application along with her Solicitor, Martin Probert.
