(Provided by the licence holder)
Public house and nightclub

1.3. Grounds for Review

The premises licence for the Eden Club, 6 Station Road, Port Talbot, SA13 1JB (Premises Licence Number 0395) in the County Borough of Neath Port Talbot

The grounds for the review are as follows:

The premises licence for the Eden Club, 6 Station Road, Port Talbot was transferred into the names of Mr Zahid Rasul and Mrs Saima Rasul following an application dated 27th May 2009. Mr Rasul became the designated premises supervisor on the 6th July 2009. The premises licence was also varied on the 6th July 2009 following an application to extend the licensed hours of the premises, however, the conditions attached to the licence remained the same as when the current licence holders became such

1. On Friday 26th June 2009, PC 1016 Williams attended at the premises and spoke to the door supervisors on duty. It was evident and confirmed by these staff that they were employed directly by the Designated Premises Supervisor, Mr Rasul. Mr Rasul is not the holder of a licence issued in the Security Industry Authority that is required to employ staff directly, under Section 3 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001. At this time a Nite Net radio was not in use at the premises, contrary to the requirements of annex 2 paragraph 2 of the premises licence.
2. At 12.30am on Monday 3rd August 2009 an incident was reported to Police as the result of which a 16 year old male was assaulted on Station Road, Port Talbot resulting in this male receiving a bloody nose and a one inch gash to the crown of his head. It was alleged that this male has been drinking with friends of the same age in the Eden Club prior to the incident.
3. At 10:30pm Sunday 23rd August 2009 PC 1016 Williams, Police Sergeant 1737 Powe and Mr Peter Malough of the Local Authority Licensing Department attended at the Eden Club.

Door Supervisors on duty were employed by Mr Zahid Rasul, contrary to Section 3 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

PC Williams asked for sight of the door supervisors log book which must be kept available for inspection in accordance with annex 2 paragraph 1 of the premises licence. This was not available, in contravention of the licence.

The premises was not using a Nite Net radio, contrary to annex 2 paragraph 1 of the premises licence.

PC Williams requested of Mr Zahid Rasul, the Designated Premises Supervisor, that in order to investigate the incident on Monday 3rd August 2009, a copy of the premises CCTV system be produced for the relevant times. Contrary to annex 2 paragraph 4 of the premises licence, this CCTV has not been available for viewing or a copy produced. This has frustrated the enquiry into the incident that occurred, and is contrary to the licensing objective of the protection of children from harm, the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety. Mr Rasul was fully apprised of matters that were contrary to the requirements of the premises licence.

4. Approximately 2.00am on Sunday 13th September 2009, an incident occurred at the premises whereby a member of doorstaff reported being assaulted by another. This was not reported until 5:17pm on Wednesday 16th September 2009 at Port Talbot Police Station.
5. At 10:30pm on Friday 18th September 2009, Police Sergeant 3355 Griffiths and Police Constable 556 Harris attended at the Eden Club. It was confirmed that door supervisors on duty at the premises were still being employed directly by Zahid Rasul, the Designated Premises Supervisor. This is contrary to Section 3 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

A Nite Net radio was not in use at the premises, contrary to annex 2 paragraph 2 of the premises licence.

6. At 11:30pm on Friday 18th September 2009 an incident took place at the premises whereby a 19 year old male was assaulted. He was approached by another male who asked him for “pills” then immediately punched him to the face. The 19 year old sustained a broken jaw which required a hospital stay and metal plates and wires being inserted into the jaw. This matter was not reported to Police by the premises staff.
7. At 10:10pm on Friday 25th September 2009 PC 1016 Williams and PC 1477 Norris attended at the Eden Club

The door supervisors on duty at the premises were employed directly by the premises DPS Zahid Rasul, contrary to Section 3 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

PC Williams asked for sight of the door staff log book. This was not produced. Contrary to the requirements of annex 2 paragraph 1 of the premises licence.

PC Williams served a written request on Mr Zahid Rasul that CCTV be accessed and copies of the door supervisors duty log be provided in respect of the incidents outlined in numbers 4 and 6 above. Mr Rasul signed receipt of this request. This information has not been provided, contrary to the requirements of annex 2 paragraphs 1 and 4 of the premises licence for both occasions. This is also contrary to the licensing objectives of the public safety and the prevention of crime and disorder. Both criminal investigations have been frustrated by the failure to comply with the conditions of the premises licence.

8. At 10:50am on Tuesday 13th October 2009 PC 1016 Williams made a telephone call to Mr Zahid Rasul. An incident of arson with intent to endanger life whereby a wheelie bin was set alight and pushed against the front door of an occupied flat. Local authority CCTV indicated suspects left the Eden Club approximately 1:41am on Sunday 11th October 2009. CCTV from the Eden Club was requested to cover this time to identify the suspects. Contrary to annex 2 paragraph 4 of the premises licence the CCTV has not been made and the investigation has been frustrated.
9. At 1:55am on Sunday 18th October 2009 a disturbance took place at the Eden Club, resulting in the officers speaking to a male person. Staff claimed this male was a member of door staff, however he was unable to provide an SIA licence. To further investigate this matter, PC 1016 Williams delivered a written request for access to the premises CCTV system and production of the premises door supervisor duty log. TO date these have not been produced, in contravention of annex 2 paragraphs 1 and 4 of the premises licence. A request is also made to ascertain which door security company supplied the staff on duty at that relevant time.

The premises still does not use a Nite Net radio, in contravention of annex 2 paragraph 2 of the premises licence.

In summary, numerous conditions of the premises licence are continually breached. These actions have frustrated a number of Police investigations and have undermined the licensing objectives, public safety, prevention of crime and disorder and protection of children from harm.

1.4. Further representations

When a review is submitted, all responsible authorities and interested parties are also able to make representations. No further representations have been received.

1.5. Policy Considerations

Licensing Policy

6.2 The Council acknowledges that licensed premises, especially those offering late night/early morning entertainment, alcohol and refreshment for large numbers of people, can be a significant source of crime and disorder problems. The Council expects the licensing trade to fully co-operate and play its part in minimising crime and disorder.

Secretary of State's Guidance

11.8 It is important to recognise that the promotion of the licensing objectives relies heavily on a partnership between licence holders, authorised persons, interested parties and responsible authorities in pursuit of common aims. It is therefore equally important that reviews are not used to drive a wedge between these groups in a way that would undermine the benefits of co-operation. It is good practice for authorised persons and responsible authorities to give licence holders early warning of their concerns about problems identified at the premises concerned and of the need for improvement. A failure to respond to such warnings is expected to lead to a decision to request a review.

11.21 Licensing authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Temporary changes or suspension of the licence for up to three months could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a necessary means of promoting the licensing objectives. So, for instance, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is necessary and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives.

1.6. Licensing Officer's Report

An application for a premises licence (formerly St Oswald's) was made on the 6th November 2006 and the current conditions were attached. The licence was transferred into the names of Mr Zahid Rasul and Mrs Saima

Rasul on the 11th June 2009 and the premises name changed to the Eden Club. A variation to the premises licence was granted on the 11th August 2009 extending the hours until 4am.

Additional information was submitted by the Police on the 8th December 2009. This relates to some of the incidents above as well as additional incidents since the submission of the application. The additional information is reproduced at appendix 1. This further information has also been provided to the premises licence holders.

When considering the application for review members are required to have regard to all relevant representations and take such steps (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The steps are:-

- (a) To modify the conditions of the licence.
- (b) To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence.
- (c) To remove the designated premises supervisor
- (d) To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months.
- (e) To revoke the licence.

1.7. Recommendation

That members determine the application after considering all relevant representations.

In respect of the impending review of the premises licence for the Eden Club, Station Road, Port Talbot I wish to submit the following information that has arisen subsequent to the date of the review forms being submitted.

At 23:45 hrs on Friday 23rd October 2009, PS 2996 Lewis attended at the premises. One of the doorstaff did not initially know the name of the door supervisor company he was working for, one was not licensed, three stated they did not work for a door company. This is contrary to Section 3 of the Private Security Act 2001. There were canned drinks being consumed at the premises, contrary to Annex 2 of the premises licence which states only polycarbonate glasses will be used. It was not possible for the officer to view the premises CCTV as the door to the office could not be unlocked by staff. A letter was served requesting production of CCTV footage in respect of an incident that occurred on Saturday 11th October 2009. This was not made available on the night, nor has it been produced subsequently. This is contrary to the conditions of the premises licence.

An assault occurred at the premises on Saturday 7th November 2009. In order to further the investigation, P.C. 4343 Workman attended at the premises on Friday 20th November 2009 to request to view and obtain a copy of the premises CCTV. The DPS,

Mr Rasul, stated that a power surge had affected the system, but he would re-contact the officer. To date no footage has been produced, contrary to annex 2 of the premises licence and the licensing objectives of public safety and the prevention of crime and disorder.



My name is Peter Malough I am a Licensing Officer with Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council. Part of my duties includes the enforcement of the legislation relating to the Licensing Act 2003.


On Sunday 23rd August 2009, I carried out a joint enforcement exercise with PC John Williams the Police Licensing Officer for South Wales Police and Sergeant Tony Powe. At approximately 22:10hrs we attended the premises known as the Eden Club, 6 Station Road, Port Talbot to ensure compliance with licensing legislation

As we entered the premises I spoke with one of the door supervisors who I know to be Richard Grey who showed me his SIA badge which permitted him to work as a door supervisor.

I then went into the premises and noticed John Williams speaking with a group of customers at the bar. As the premises had only recently opened it was not that busy and I would say there were approximately 10 people inside the premises.

I then spoke to a female working behind the bar and asked if I could see the Premises Licence Summary but she could not find the document.

I then noticed the Premises Licence holder and Designated Premises Supervisor Mr Rasul walking towards the bar area where I was standing. I introduced myself to Mr Rasul and asked if I could see the Premises Licence

Summary. Mr Rasul started looking through a pile of paper work that was kept behind the bar but he could not locate the Summary document. Mr Rasul said that Peter Hall his licensing consultant had emailed it over to him and he was waiting for the original to be posted to him. I confirmed to Mr Rasul that under the Licensing Act 2003 the Premises Licence Summary must always be displayed.

I then asked Mr Rasul if I could look through his door supervisor register which should be kept at the premises indicating the names, licence details and times of work of the door staff.

Mr Rasul went back to the bar area to look for the document but could not find it. We then went to the front entrance of the premises as it was quieter and met John Williams who at this time had been speaking to the door supervisors.

John Williams formally introduced himself to Mr Rasul and again asked for the door supervisor record. Mr Rasul stated that this register had been taken home by one of the other door supervisors the previous night. He confirmed the door supervisor register also forms part of the incident book and as there had been a number of incidents the previous night, he wanted to take it home to tidy it up. John Williams explained that it was a condition of his licence that it must be kept on the premises.


John Williams also asked if Mr Rasul had Nite Net radio as this premises must participate in this scheme. Mr Rasul didn't know about this and John Williams again explained that this was a condition of his licence and gave Mr Rasul details of a person who he should contact to set it up.

I then told Mr Rasul that it is important that he looks through his premises licence and complies with all the conditions that have been attached. Mr Rasul did confirm that he had recently put in a variation of his licence and was not sure what conditions had been attached to it. I explained to Mr Rasul that no extra conditions had been attached to his licence and these conditions had been on his licence since he took over the premises twelve weeks ago.

John Williams then spoke to Mr Rasul about who employs his door supervisors. Mr Rasul confirmed he employed them so John Williams confirmed as he doesn't have a rear of house licence he was committing another offence.

I have made this statement to the best of my recollection of the incident. I am willing to assist the Police with their enquiries, and I am willing to attend Court to give evidence if I am required to do so.



I am currently investigating an assault which occurred at the EDEN CLUB, STATION RD, PORT TALBOT on 7/11/2009. As part of this investigation on 20/11/2009 I attended at EDEN to carry out any enquiries in relation to possible CCTV footage.			
On attending the club I conferred with the owner in the presence of my colleague PC 4343 PYLE. I requested to see any CCTV footage in relation to the above incident. The owner stated to me that they had had an electrical surge at the club the previous week which had caused the tills and CCTV to 'blow' loosing some footage.			
The owner went on to explain that someone was coming out the following Monday (22/11/2009) to have a look at the CCTV system and possibly try and retrieve any lost footage. The owner then took my details "PC 4961 WORKMAN PORT TALBOT POLICE STATION 01639 635321" and details of my shift pattern. He insisted he would contact me at 2200-2230 on 22/11/2009 with an update of whether footage was retrieved and would invited me to the club to view any footage I required.			
I have not received any further contact from the owner of the EDEN club and not seen any footage in relation to the above incident.
