Report of the Head of Legal and Democratic Services

1. **LICENSING ACT 2003 (HEARINGS) REGULATION 2005 –
APPLICATION FOR THE VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENCE –
JJ SUPERMARKET, 111 – 113 BRITON FERRY ROAD, NEATH,
SA11 1AS**

The Sub Committee was asked to consider an Application for the variation of the Licence for the above mentioned premises. The circulated report contained details of the Application under the Licensing Act 2003.

The Applicant and a family member were present at the meeting, as well as an interested party, and the local Ward Member. The Licensing Officer circulated a street plan of the local area, as well as an interior layout plan of JJ Supermarket, to all present, allowing sufficient time for Members to read.

Members noted that representations had been made from the Police Authority (Appendix 1 to the circulated report), but these had subsequently been withdrawn following the Applicant agreeing to the conditions as set out in Appendix 1.

The variation Application was as follows:-

The Opening Hours of the Premises

Monday to Sunday : 06.00 – 23.00

Supply of Alcohol : Off Sales

Monday to Sunday : 24 hours

Members noted that between the hours of 11pm – 6am the shop would be shut to the public with alcohol deliveries only.

RESOLVED: that the Application be granted with the following conditions:-

- (a) that the Premises will be closed to members of the public between the hours of 23.00 – 06.00;
- (b) that the sale of alcohol to members of the public attending at the premises shall only be permitted between the hours of 08.00 – 23.00;
- (c) that the sale of alcohol between the hours of 23.00 – 08.00 shall only be by way of pre-booked telephone orders which are to be delivered by vehicle to separate premises;
- (d) that only alcohol sold via the store should be on the delivery vehicle at any time and there should be no unsold alcohol on the vehicle;
- (e) that there must be a log on the delivery vehicle which itemises the vehicles contents;
- (f) that there must be a log kept on the premises of all alcohol on the delivery vehicle. (The logs referred to in (e) and (f) must match and will ensure that the unlicensed sales do not take place from the delivery vehicle).
