Report of the Head of Legal Services

1. <u>LICENSING (2003) ACT - PREMISES LICENCE APPLICATION – THE FERRYMAN INN, 136 NEATH ROAD, BRITON FERRY, NEATH</u>

The Sub Committee was asked to consider an application for both Conversion and Variation of a Transitional Premises Licence for the Ferryman Inn, 136 Neath Road, Briton Ferry, Neath.

The applicant's representative, Mr.R.Lucas, from Celtic Inns was present together with objectors to the application.

A plan indicating the site of the premises which was the subject of the application was circulated at the meeting.

(a) Conversion Application

The Sub Committee was informed that, as the premises had traded as a Public House for many years, the applicant would be entitled to a premises licence for the sale of alcohol, with the previous permitted hours becoming conditions of the new licence.

2. <u>LICENSING (2003) ACT – TRANSITIONAL PREMISES</u> <u>LICENCE APPLICATION – FARMERS ARMS, 42 BURROWS</u> <u>ROAD, SKEWEN, NEATH</u>

(b) <u>Variation Application</u>

The Sub Committee noted that, due to discussions held prior to the meeting with the Fire Officer, the objections of the Fire Service had been withdrawn. In addition, due to the provision of music being background music only, the objections of Environment Health had also been withdrawn.

In addition to the above, it was noted that the request to remove all embedded restrictions inherent in the Licensing Act 1964, Cinematography (Safety) Regulations 1955 and the Children and Young Persons Act 1953 had also been withdrawn.

In accordance with the prescribed procedure, the Sub Committee heard representations from the applicant who was questioned by all relevant parties concerned.

The circulated report contained details of information provided by the applicant relating to the promotion of the four licensing objections.

As a result of representations received from the Police the applicant agreed to reduce the number of non-standard events to 12 per annum, at the applicant's discretion.
