<u>Proposed Local Government (Wales) Measure - Consultation Response - Neath Port Talbot C.B.C.</u>

Purpose of Report

To obtain Members' approval for the response prepared on behalf of Neath Port Talbot C.B.C., in respect of the Proposed Local Government (Wales) Measure.

Background

The Welsh Assembly Government recently published its Proposed Local Government (Wales) Measure which is in line with proposals outlined in 'A Shared Responsibility' (March 2007) and the consultation 'Delivering A Shared Responsibility' published earlier this year.

By introducing this Measure, the Assembly Government is seeking to tidy up the Wales Programme for Improvement, improve coordination of/and reduce burden of regulation and inspection and also strengthen the community planning process with the proposed new duty of cooperation on other public bodies as well as a duty on Ministers to promote community planning.

An Assembly Committee has been established to scrutinise and take evidence on the Proposed Measure and is currently in the process of inviting comments thereon.

An appropriate response has been prepared and is attached at Appendix A.

Recommendation

That the draft response to the Assembly Committee's consultation exercise in respect of the Local Government (Wales) Measure be approved.

Proposed Local Government (Wales) Measure

Consultation Response - Neath Port Talbot C.B.C.

Introduction

The National Assembly has established a Committee to consider and report on the general principles of the Proposed Local Government Measure. The Welsh Local Government Association has been invited to present evidence to this Committee and it has, in turn, invited individual organisations affected by these proposals to submit any comments, views or concerns they may have in relation to this matter.

Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council welcomes the opportunity to comment on some of the issues raised by the proposals, with particular reference to the following matters:

- 1. The Measure's overall intention is to:
- create a statutory regime which better integrates long-term strategic planning and shorter term service improvement;
- amend the law better to reflect the distinctive nature and role of local government in Wales;
- build on the experience of authorities and others operating within the current regimes.

The Council fully supports the intentions described above.

- 2. In particular, the Measure:
- expands authorities' duties in relation to secure improvement, in particular emphasising that enhancing local wellbeing, sustainability and social equity are as valid as improving quantified service outputs or efficiency;

Supported.

• create a general power for authorities (including local authorities, National Parks and Fire and Rescue Authorities) to collaborate with each other to secure improvement, and a reserve power for Ministers to direct this;

Whilst the Council supports the proposal to create a general power for authorities to collaborate, the reserved power proposed for Ministers to direct collaboration gives cause for concern. How does it fit with the notion of local government? Isn't it for local determination as to whether collaboration is desirable for our local population? Given the hostility that this proposal created during the earlier consultation exercise, it is of little comfort to know that it is now emphasised that the Welsh Ministers' power to direct collaboration is in effect a power to intervene, which will be similar to the power to intervene that the Welsh Ministers currently have under the best value legislation.

• confer more scope to use performance data to account to citizens and communities about the levels of service they are providing;

The perceived issue here is how best to encourage residents to engage with the accountability process rather than issues around the use of performance data to inform citizens about levels of service. However, the Council is not opposed to this particular intention.

• secure greater collaboration between local government auditors, regulators and inspectors so as to maximise value and minimise burdens (this largely entails placing existing best practice on a statutory basis);

The Council is of the view that the current level of audit, regulation and inspection work is placing ever greater demands on Officers and is diverting resources from the delivery of services. Any proposals which add value and reduce the burden of inspection/regulation is therefore welcomed.

• expand and clarify Ministers' powers to support local authority improvement and to intervene where necessary;

Intervention, like the reserve powers proposed for Ministers to direct collaboration, is an issue which this Authority is not comfortable in accepting without a full understanding of the controls that will be implemented.

3. Local authorities, National Park authorities and Fire and Rescue authorities will be subject to a duty to make arrangements to secure continuous improvement in the exercise of their functions. In doing

so it must have regard in particular to the need to improve the exercise of its functions in respect of seven aspects of improvement. The Measure also sets other duties for these authorities in terms of accounting for that improvement.

Having regard to the seven aspects of improvement is a new requirement. In practice, improvement is inevitably achieved by trading off the items on the list against each other. This seems an unnecessary, onerous, additional burden.

4. Welsh Ministers are provided with a power to prescribe by order factors of performance (performance indicators) against which a Welsh improvement authority's performance will be measured. In addition Welsh Ministers may set performance standards in respect of the performance standards set by them. The Measure also gives Welsh Ministers by order the discretion to specify different performance indicators and standards for different authorities or types of authorities.

There are a number of issues in respect of these proposals, not least of which is the apparent move away from the current method of maintaining the National Performance Measurement Framework. A considerable amount of thought and effort went into developing the existing Framework and whilst it may not be considered "fit for purpose" by many, it is a valid attempt to seek comparison over time and between Authorities' performance in delivering a broad range of activities.

On the issue of Ministers setting minimum standards, there are concerns, similar to those held about collaboration, that such standards are a local issue which are for local Members to determine, having regard to all relevant local and national considerations. The imposition of national minimum standards fetters the discretion and decision making ability of locally elected representatives and dilutes the accountability of local government to its citizens. The proposal to establish national minimum standards must be challenged as to its evidence base and its relevance to the local government community. The substitution of national minimum standards for the current WPI arrangements will impair and not enhance local improvement work.

QUARTERLY PERFORMANCE INDICATOR DATA - OVERVIEW

Purpose of the Report:

Policy and Resources Cabinet Board is responsible for monitoring performance for a wide range of activities throughout the Authority. In accordance with this "overview" role, the purpose of this report is to advise Members of the actual performance achieved against predetermined targets as specified in the Authority's "Improvement Plan - 08/09", for the second quarter of the current financial year i.e., 1st April 2008 to 30th September 2008.

This data, which is attached at Appendix 1, is for information purposes only. Members particular attention is drawn to those performance indicators that did not achieve their targets (or within 5% of their targets) during the period being reported.

PI's currently not achieving pre-determined targets - with explanations, where provided:

EDU/008b The number of permanent exclusions during the academic year per 1,000 pupils from:

Target - 2.23 Actual - 2.45

L(Yth) 2 The percentage of 11 - 19 year olds in contact with the service

Target - 20 Actual - 5.65

This is a new indicator, and it seems that the target figure has been overestimated given that the service cannot include initial contacts made by the detached and street based team, or contacts made by the Relationship, Advice and Drop in Service (RADS). In these cases personal details, such as name, address, and date of birth are not collected so numbers cannot be verified by audit.

SCA/001 The rate of delayed transfers of care for social care reasons per 1,000 population aged 75 or over

Target - 5 Actual - 7.21

The number of delayed transfers of care for social care reasons for August and September have been above the targeted level, which have led to a dip in performance. The primary reason for this has been the unavailability of care packages resulting from lack of capacity in the independent sector (particularly in valley communities) and restraints on the in-house home care budget. Significant work has been undertaken during September/October to help resolve pressures and bring performance back to target. The introduction of the new home care enabling centre in mid-January should also reduce delays.

b) The percentage of referrals during the year that were allocated to someone other than a social worker for initial assessment

Target - 5 Actual - 24.6

SCC/008a The percentage of initial assessments carried out within 7 working days

Target - 60 Actual - 56

SCC/008b The average time taken to complete initial assessments that took longer than 7 working days to complete

Target - 14 Actual - 17.7

SCC/009b The average time taken to complete core assessments that took longer than 35 days

Target - 50 Actual - 63.4

Core assessments carried out within 35 working days and average times over 35 working days (SCC/009a&b) are showing evidence of an improvement in performance. There are several timeline requirements for the completion of core assessments and the system has yet to be developed to report all three timeline criteria. It is the intention that the system will be further developed throughout 2008/09.

SCC/013a(iii) The percentage of open cases of children who have an allocated social worker - Children in need

Target - 85 Actual - 56.9

SCC/021 The percentage of looked after children reviews carried out within statutory timescales during the year

Target - 100 Actual - 93.3

SCC/023b The average number of days spent out of school on fixedterm exclusions for children looked after who were excluded in the year 1 April - 31 March

Target - 5 Actual - 7.3

Performance for fixed- period exclusions is slightly outside target and analysis of these exclusions has been commissioned to determine if further strategies should be in place for the 7 young people involved.

SCC/024 The percentage of children looked after during the year with a Personal Education Plan within 20 school days of entering care or joining a new school in the year ending 31 March

Target - 75 Actual - 47.2

SCC/025 The percentage of statutory visits to looked after children due in the year that took place in accordance with regulations

Target - 95 Actual - 71.3

The percentage of statutory visits to looked after children continues to be a challenging area. However, performance is on an upward path (2007/08 – 60%) and is gradually working towards the 2008/09 set target.

SCC/033b The percentage of young people formerly looked after with whom the authority is in contact, who are known to be in suitable, non-emergency accommodation at the age of 19

Target - 100 Actual - 94.1

SCC/033c The percentage of young people formerly looked after with whom the authority is in contact, who are known to be engaged in education, training or employment at the age of 19

Target - 60 Actual - 23.5

SCC/033a demonstrates the Directorate's excellent performance (100%) around maintaining contact with formerly looked after children. However, part (c), is below target due to the cohort of children who are, by virtue to their previous circumstances, disengaged. This reflects a general trend of children not in education, training or employment across the authority.

HLS/010c The average number of calendar days taken to complete nonurgent repairs

Target - 27 Actual - 29.9

PSR/002 The average number of calendar days taken to deliver a Disabled Facilities Grant

Target - 580 Actual - 636

PLA/004 a) The percentage of major planning applications determined during the year within 13 weeks

Target - 30 Actual - 20

b) The percentage of minor planning applications determined during the year within 8 weeks

Target - 50 Actual - 38.4

c) The percentage of householder planning applications determined during the year within 8 weeks

Target - 75 Actual - 67.4

d) The percentage of all other planning applications determined during the year within 8 weeks

Target - 70 Actual - 39.7

We are currently falling below our thresholds in terms of determining applications within the targeted timescales as we are currently undergoing a review with 15% of the team seconded out of their jobs to undertake the review. This has left us short staffed and as such officers have larger workloads and it is therefore taking longer to determine applications.
