2. <u>APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF DISPENSATION UNDER</u> <u>SECTION 81(4) LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 2000</u>

(a) <u>Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council Member in</u> respect of a member of their family employed by the Council

The Committee considered the application from Councillor Mrs.B.Richards, in respect of a request for dispensation relating to family members employed by the Authority.

RESOLVED:

<u>Private Report of the Head of Legal and Democratic Services/</u> Monitoring Officer

4. <u>REFERRAL FROM THE OMBUDSMAN</u>

The above circulated report contained details of an investigation by the Local Government Ombudsman in relation to a complaint of a breach of the Code of Conduct by a Community Councillor. The report also set out the adopted procedures in respect of Code of Conduct Hearings.

The Committee were informed by the Head of Legal and Democratic Services/Monitoring Officer that the person against whom the allegation was made, was no longer a Member of the Community Council concerned. The former Community Councillor had also declined to attend the meeting of the Standards Committee and had not given any written representations.

The Committee gave detailed consideration to the Ombudsman's findings, as set out in the circulated report and as presented to the Committee by the Ombudsman's Representative, Mrs. K. Shaw. Members also took into account the procedural advice as provided by the Head of Legal and Democratic Services/Monitoring Officer.

RESOLVED:

- (a) that, taking into account the findings of the Local Government Ombudsman in respect of this case, the Standards Committee is satisfied that there is evidence of a breach of the Member Code of Conduct Paragraphs 4(a) and 6(1)(b), and that therefore the Committee's decision be as follows:-
 - (i) by virtue of his conduct on 28th March, 2008, which was inappropriate and lacking in respect and consideration for others, the Community Councillor had breached the above-mentioned paragraphs of the Code. The conduct was also likely to bring the office of Community Councillor and indeed the Community Council itself into disrepute, even though his actions had been undertaken when he was not exercising his role as Community Councillor;
 - (ii) the Standards Committee will therefore issue a censure to the former Community Councillor for his conduct under Regulation 9 (1) (c) of the 2001 Regulations;
- (b) Subject to an appeal being lodged, the decision of the Standards Committee and a report on the investigation will be published in accordance with the statutory requirements.
