1. Action points from meeting held on 23rd April 2010 to be carried over to 10th September 2010.

2. **Extraordinary JRC meeting**

2.1. Topic – The Joint Resilience Committee Annual Agenda

- 2.1.1. Following the JRC meeting held on 2nd July 2010, it was agreed that the format, structure and governance of the Joint Resilience Committee would be reviewed and new proposals presented to the Chair.
- 2.1.2. The Joint Resilience Unit was asked to prepare an annual agenda with key subject areas, outcomes and actions for the JRC to consider at an extraordinary meeting scheduled for the 13th August.
- 2.1.3. A meeting was held on the 9th July with the Chair to address the proposals prior to a presentation being delivered to the JRC at the August committee meeting.

2.2. Outcomes

The meeting has resulted in the following outcomes. More information will be included in a presentation from the Resilience Manager.

- The JRC Programme to be divided into three headline categories, being:
 - a) Information & Awareness
 - b) Key priorities
 - c) Business/Operational
- These categories will provide the structure for reporting in future to the JRC. Each category will have at least one subject.
- The reports will be in an agreed structure to include the additional headings of topic/subject matter, the link to legislation, the purpose of the report and any options and/or recommendations.
- The report will also have, as its first item, any actions from previous meetings and a progress update.

- It was also identified that there was a need to 're brand' the role of the JRC and its involvement in how the work is developed, progressed and audited. The development of the annual agenda was one of those actions.
- To reflect the new approach to governance, the Terms of Reference have been amended and agreed. These will be sent to both Chief Executives.

2.3. Recommendations

- Joint Resilience Committee agrees the proposed annual agenda.
- Joint Resilience Committee agree the new reporting structure and governance arrangements.
- Joint Resilience Committee adopts the reviewed Terms of Reference in Section 1 of the report.

- Meet every two months to oversee the development of emergency planning, business continuity and risk management strategies and processes so that the Authorities meet their Civil Contingency duties.
- Review, scrutinise and inform the development of a Resilience Work Programme for both Authorities.
- To promote improved Resilience partnership working with the South Wales Local Resilience Forum, partner agencies and stakeholders.
- To raise the understanding of the Local Authorities' statutory duties under the Civil Contingencies Act and other Emergency Planning Legislation, and to escalate issues within each Authority, as appropriate
- Promote and support the work carried out by the Joint Resilience Unit to raise awareness of the implementation of the civil contingency duties of the Local Authority as a Category 1 responder.
- To build and develop through Community Leadership the awareness and need for more resilience and cohesion within our own communities
- Arrange Elected Member Seminars, training, awareness and informative events to further develop the resilience agenda.
- Receive for scrutiny an annual Resilience Review Report from the Chief Executives for presentation to full Council.
