## 6. **EFFAITH COVID AR WASANAETHAU AC ARCHWILIADAU HYLENDID BWYD**

Rhoddodd swyddogion gyflwyniad manwl i'r Aelodau. Byddai copi o'r cyflwyniad yn cael ei ddosbarthu i'r Aelodau ar ôl y cyfarfod.

Y Tîm Diogelu Bwyd ac Iechyd oedd y tîm y galwyd arnynt i gefnogi'r gwasanaeth Profi Olrhain a Diogelu (POD). Aeth swyddogion drwy swyddogaethau eraill y tîm a oedd yn cynnwys diogelwch bwyd a rheoli clefydau heintus. Amlinellwyd effeithiau'r ymateb i COVID ar waith y tîm, gan gynnwys atal archwiliadau rhagweithiol.

Rhoddyd gwybodaeth i'r Aelodau mewn perthynas â'r canlyniad o ran archwiliadau hylendid bwyd ar gyfer 2019-2020 cyn y cyfyngiadau symud. Yn dilyn y cyfyngiadau symud, lluniodd yr Asiantaeth Safonau Bwyd (ASB) arweiniad newydd i flaenoriaethu'r ymateb i COVID a hefyd beryglon Diogelwch Bwyd difrifol o arwyddocâd iechyd cyhoeddus. Roedd y rhan fwyaf o'r tîm hefyd yn rhan o'r gwaith i gefnogi cartrefi gofal. Yn ogystal, cyfrannodd y tîm at ddarparu arweiniad i fusnesau mewn perthynas â'r cyfyngiadau a gyhoeddwyd gan Lywodraeth Cymru.

Roedd angen sefydlu timau newydd yn dilyn yr ymateb cychwynnol i gynorthwyo â'r ymateb POD. Ymdriniodd y tîm rhanbarthol â'r achosion mwy cymhleth.

Blaenoriaethwyd y prosiect Cartrefi Gofal ynghyd â chyngor hylendid bwyd i fusnesau newydd. Derbyniwyd amryw gwynion ynghylch y rheoliadau a'r cyfyngiadau a oedd ar waith.

Pan gyrhaeddodd ton achosion y gaeaf, roedd yr ymatebion yn seiliedig ar egwyddor brysben. Dywedwyd wrth yr Aelodau am wasanaeth 7 niwrnod y Tîm Ymateb Rhanbarthol a oedd ac sy'n dal i gael ei ddarparu ar sail ewylls da gan swyddogion.

Yn dilyn y Nadolig 2020 a chynnydd y rhaglen frechu, dechreuodd y tîm ystyried adferiad. Cyfradd yr archwiliadau eiddo ar gyfer blwyddyn 2020/21 oedd 14%.

Cyhoeddwyd y canllawiau adfer diweddaraf gan yr ASB ym Mehefin 2021. Cyfeiriodd swyddogion hefyd at bwysigrwydd adferiad staff, gyda llawer yn awr yn cael eu hannog i gymryd eu gwyliau blynnyddol.

Nododd swyddogion yr amserlen ar gyfer adfer, o ran archwiliadau eiddo. Bydd y rhan fwyaf o ddyddiadau'n cael eu pennu gan yr ASB cyn gynted ag y bydd adnoddau llawn yn caniatáu. Yn ogystal â gwaith rhagweithiol, mae gwaith ymatebol y mae'n rhaid ei wneud.

Dywedwyd wrth yr Aelodau fod Llywodraeth Cymru yn parhau i ddarparu cyllid bob chwe mis ac o ganlyniad, mae'n anodd cynllunio, recriwtio a lleoli adnoddau. Mae hyn yn ei gwneud hi'n anodd cyflawni parhad ar draws y gwasanaeth.

Holodd yr Aelodau a oes modd cyflawni'r disgwyliadau a osodwyd gan yr ASB. Dywedodd Swyddogion eu bod yn teimlo'n wedol hyderus y gellir eu cyflawni, ond bod cafeatau i hyn, gan gynnwys ymateb POD Llywodraeth Cymru a thymor y gaeaf sydd ar ddod.

Canmolodd yr Aelodau staff y tîm am eu gwaith caled yn ystod y cyfnod anodd, llawn straen hwn.

Dywedodd swyddogion nad oedd rhestr aros yn draddodiadol yng Nghastell-nedd Port Talbot ar gyfer y gwasanaeth hwn. Fodd bynnag, oherwydd pwysau ar y gwasanaeth, gan gynnwys swyddi gwag a salwch, bu cynnydd yn y rhestr aros. Mae'r Bwrdd lechyd wedi cadarnhau y caiff yr holl swyddi gwag ar gyfer y tîm eu hysbysebu, ac os c'ant eu llenwi, dylai hyn gynorthwyo gyda lleihau'r rhestr aros. Mae effaith absenoldeb salwch ar y gwasanaeth hefyd wedi'i hamlygu.

O ran yr adolygiad y disgwyli'r iddo gael ei gynnal, trefnwyd i'r Bwrdd lechyd ei wneud, gydag amserlen cwblhau erbyn diwedd mis Medi. Fodd bynnag, nid oes gan swyddogion CNPT wybodaeth bellach am yr eitem hon ac maent yn aros am ganlyniad yr adolygiad.

Holodd yr Aelodau pam yr oedd y rhieni sy'n dioddef dro ar ôl tro wedi dirywio'n sylweddol yn ystod y pandemig. Dywedodd swyddogion y

bu cynnydd mawr mewn atgyfeiriadau newydd gyda lefel uwch o drais na welwyd mohono o'r blaen. # Background & Context



The Crime and Disorder Act (1998), as amended by the Police Reform Act (2002), places a statutory obligation on local authorities and the Police to form multi-agency partnerships in order to reduce crime and disorder across the local authority area.

Safer Neath Port Talbot Partnership operates a multi-agency partnership approach to community safety and crime and disorder issues.

As a partnership, we are committed to working together to achieve sustainable reductions in crime, fear of crime and anti social behaviour as well as providing practical crime prevention and community safety advice and reassurance.

Safer Neath Port Talbot is made up of the following statutory partners:

- South Wales Police
- Swansea Bay University Health Board
- Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service
- National Probation Service

# Background & Context

- The CSP is jointly chaired by NPTCBC and SWP
- Over the past 18 months, the general picture around Community Safety has drastically changed.
- There have been increased demands in many service areas, directly attributed to the Covid-19 pandemic, lockdown & subsequent changing restrictions.
- Some issues in our town centres & communities have increased & become more visible.
- We have a strong CSP, which is well attended, and at which partners actively participate and we have a shared purpose
- Everyone plays their part, but it is important to remember the role of the Council's team and that of the respective partners
- The police are the lead agency for ASB, and other criminal matters
- The Council's Community Safety Team have no enforcement responsibilities and limited resource, but bring partners together to find solutions

# Neath Town Centre

In July 2021, members were given a detailed presentation on the issues of Anti Social Behaviour in Neath Town Centre, and are summarised below



## SWP Operation Lilium continues

Partnership meetings continue, whereby relevant agencies will attend and provide recent updates on their ongoing work. This includes; Licensing, CCTV, Business Crime Reduction Partnership, WCADA, Salvation Army, Housing Options and others.

There is a rolling action plan, to ensure work continues and is progressed. Regular reports are fed into the Safer NPT Partnership Board.

# Neath Town Centre

A series of actions have been agreed or are ongoing;

- Police Operation initiated and is ongoing
- Issuing of s35'S, Community Protection Warnings / Notices and Criminal Behaviour Orders to prolific offenders
- Communications Plan to keep residents updated on ongoing work, and to encourage reporting
- Community Safety Engagement Events (restrictions permitted) to speak with members of the public and answer their questions
- Promotion of the Business Crime Reduction Partnership to businesses, traders and licensed premises
- Licensing have visited all businesses to advise and remind about responsible sales of alcohol
- CCTV monitoring of 'hotspot' areas has changed
- Continued outreach support for those with complex needs
- Ongoing supported for residents of the Ambassador with rehousing, outreach, diversionary activities



# Port Talbot Town Centre



In recent months there have been growing concerns from traders and residents, regarding increased ASB in areas of the town centre.

Operation Sudbury has been implemented, which sees increased patrols in the town centre. Community Protection Warnings have been issued to prolific offenders.

Current reports remain low, but there is an increased focus in encouraging people to report what they see, to ensure we have a true reflection of the issues.

In October a partnership meeting was called, including the Leader, Chief Executive, Stephen Kinnock MP and local ward Councillors. Also in attendance were and various internal and external partners. Number of actions noted and further meeting tba

These meetings will coincide with the Recovery Group, coordinated by the Town Centre Manager, and work of the Business Improvement District (Viva Port Talbot)

# Briton Ferry



During summer of 2020 partners met to discuss concerns from local residents about particular areas of Briton Ferry and an increase in Anti-Social Behaviour.

This differed to our town centre issues in that it could attributed to a small number of individual properties. We worked closely with the local Councillors, Housing Options and Environmental Health to alleviate some of those concerns.

In recent months there have been additional concerns from residents, with South Wales Police hosting a very well attended PACT Meeting.

There is a need for further work with Environmental Health, Police, Youth Justice and other partners.

During summer of 2021 Community Safety have hosted engagement events with the public to promote various campaigns, share messages on crime prevention and to encourage reports through to the appropriate agencies.

## Neighbour Disputes

Throughout the Covid-19 pandemic and lockdown, there has been an increase in the number of contacts to the Council and the Police over neighbour disputes.

Residents now spend far more time at home, which has led to more disputes and complaints.

The ASB Coordinator works closely with the Police, Housing Providers and Environmental Health on these matters, offering mediation and in some cases Good Neighbour Agreements to try to alleviate some concerns.

In some instances, these are civil matters and cannot be addressed by the partnership.

## Scarlett Avenue Car Park

A small number of complaints have been received by residents over the use of the open car park. Including; speeding cars and noise nuisance. Community Safety have visited residents to offer advice and encourage reporting. This is a council owned car park and Environment colleagues are exploring options to alleviate issues and concerns.



# Street Vulnerability MARAC's



Throughout the Covid-19 pandemic and lockdown, the SV MARAC's have continued, despite changes to Homelessness legislation, meaning that all street homeless people must be accommodated by the local authority.

Usually homelessness does not come alone and is associated with a number of other factors like loss of employment, alcohol or substance addiction, poor mental health, fleeing domestic abuse.

The SV MARAC is coordinated by NPT Community Safety and chaired by South Wales Police. Local individuals are discussed by a number of agencies and an action plan is agreed to ensure they are appropriately supported and to monitor their progress.

This area of work has significant links with the reduction of Anti-Social Behaviour in our communities, and has mobilised well during the pandemic.
