1. To consider an application by Environmental Health for the review of the premises licence for the Other Place (Live Lounge)

Executive Summary

- 2. This is an application under the Licensing Act 2003 for a review of a licensed premises for the Other Place (Live Lounge).
- 3. The application for review has been submitted by Environmental Health on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance.
- 4. Additional representations were received from Legal Regulatory Services (Licensing), South Wales Police and several residents.

Background

- 5. At any stage following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority may ask the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter(s) arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives.
- 6. When a licensing authority receives an application for a review from a responsible authority, it must arrange a hearing. The arrangements for the hearing must follow the provisions set out in regulations.
- 7. Where the licensing authority considers that action under its statutory powers is appropriate, it may take any of the following steps:
 - modify the conditions of the licence (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition);
 - to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - to remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months.
 - To revoke the licence.

Grounds for Review

- 8. The Environmental Health Section of Neath Port Talbot Council wish to make an application to review the Premises Licence for Live Lounge 9 Ynysderw Road Pontardawe SA9 4EG (Premises Licence Number: PREM-0322).
- The Environmental Health review application primarily focuses on the failure to promote 'The Prevention of Public Nuisance' Licensing Objective.
- 10. The decision to make the review application has not been taken lightly; but it is felt that this is the only remaining option to achieve compliance, and attain ongoing protection for the local residents from excessive noise arising from activities at, and in the vicinity of the licensed premises: causing Public Nuisance.
- 11. Issues in relation to the premises have been ongoing for a number of years. Several attempts to resolve concerns amicably with the licence holders but these have failed, and Abatement Notices has been served due to the ongoing regular nuisance emanating from the premises. Environmental Health Officers have attempted to work with the premises to reach a solution that suits all parties.
- 12. The Premises License Holders (PLH) are HD Pub Investments Ltd and are the registered owners of the premises with The Land Registry. The management of the premises is overseen by Hans Andrei Dionisio Erive; as the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) and Andrew Davies; the Manager.
- 13. Noise Abatement Notices have been served on the (PLH), (DPS) and Andrew Davies, on 15th September 2022.
- 14. Having reviewed the history of complaints in relation to the premises; initially there has been a pattern of short term compliance following Local Authority intervention, but complaints would be received again. The management controls that are in place are inadequate for the type of entertainment they are providing in a building that is not suitably constructed to contain electronically amplified rock music, played at high volume.
- 15. The building was formerly the Royal British Legion Club. The entertainment provided in these types of premises is historically darts,

- dominoes, bingo, a party for a special occasion: Mostly low volume activities that do not require the building to be suitably constructed for sound attenuation.
- 16. The community Facebook Page has shown there to be a section of the community who are not sympathetic to the residents who are being affected. A number of comments have been made along the lines of: if you don't want the noise of a pub; don't buy a house next to a pub. It must be considered however; that many of the residents living in Ynysderw Road and Francis Street have lived in their homes a long time, e.g. 30 and 40 years before the premises became a live music venue. The premises has evolved into a venue that is unsuited to the location; surrounded on 2 sides by residential premises in extremely close proximity.
- 17. Complaints in 2021 regarding noise from the premises commenced almost as soon as the premises opened and Premises Licence Holder after Covid restrictions within the hospitality sector were relaxed. Environmental Health received complaints of excessive noise from music emanating from the premises.
- 18. An application was made by the (PLH) for a minor variation for the provision of an outdoor bar and entertainment on the car park. Objections were made due to Environmental Health Officer having concern for Public Nuisance to be caused.
- 19. An announced visit to the premises was made by Environmental Health, Licensing and Police Licensing on the 15th July 2021 to discuss the application for the variation of the Premises Licence, noise complaints and Covid controls. The premises was represented by Robert Megson. During this visit Rachel Matthews of The Environmental Health Team, discussed that music levels needed to be to be quieter due to the location of the pub in a residential area.
- 20. Mr Megson explained that he had carried out work to sound proof the rear function room, by having ceiling tiles, triple glazing to the right hand side of the function room, and had sealed gaps in the structure of the building. Unfortunately the specifications of the sound reduction of these materials was unknown. The remaining left hand side of the function room with the windows facing Francis Street, and diagonally across to Ynysderw Road; does not have triple glazed windows. There are also a significant amount

- of areas in the construction of the building that allow the noise inside to escape, adversely affecting the residents.
- 21. In addition; Rachel Matthews advised that there were concerns over the disturbance caused by the presence of people outside the premises, until late, i.e. 01.00hours.
- 22. HD Pub Investments Ltd, the (DPS) and the Manager have been notified on several occasions of the public nuisance that is emanating from, and in the vicinity of; the Live Lounge premises.
- 23. Letters were sent in October 2021 and November 2021 and again in March 2022 advising that complaints continue.
- 24. A meeting on 5th May was held with representatives of the premises: the (DPS) Hans Erive Dionsio and Andrew Davies with Environmental Health Officers: Gareth Liley and Rachel Matthews. Mr Liley advised the representatives that the control measures that they stated they were carrying out: measuring with a sound meter, installation of ceiling tiles, foam filler, triple glazed windows to the right hand side of the function room were insufficient to prevent a nuisance.
- 25. Documents with specifications of sound reduction of the materials used were unavailable and the management controls proposed such as; use of the hand held sound level meter were being misunderstood. In addition the sound level meter was not of the scientific grade and was not calibrated by an accredited laboratory.
- 26. The representatives were advised that they needed to have the premises assessed by an Acoustic Consultant, registered with the Institute of Acoustics, and any assessment to be carried out was to be approved with the Environmental Health Department.
- 27. The representatives were advised that until this had been successfully completed; they should not continue to provide music entertainment that causes a nuisance.
- 28. Complaints about disturbance from loud music have continued, as well as complaints about patrons causing late night disturbance.
- 29. In addition to the meetings with company representatives: Letters and emails have been written to the PLH, and the DPS advising them of these

complaints and that monitoring results will contribute to consideration of enforcement action:

- 30. In response to this situation; Environmental Health Officers have carried out a noise monitoring programme, to ascertain if the complaints are valid. Witness statements from 6 Environmental Health Officers have reported that a public nuisance has been caused emanating from these premises. The Officers were deployed over the spring and summer months and have reported that nuisance occurred on approximately 7 occasions. The nuisance is comprised of excessively loud electronically amplified music, usually with drums, electric guitars and singing, and usually lasts for approximately 2 hours. The Officers have not been present for all events, due to staffing issues, but on those occasions where they have been present; nuisance has been witnessed. Making the primary concern for The Environmental Health Team being repeated, excessively loud music emanating from the premises; this relates to indoor and outdoor music, on any day from Friday or Saturday night to Sunday afternoon/ evening:
- 31. Officers of the Environmental Health Team have provided witness statements that evidence nuisance being caused on: (dates)

8th April 2022

20th May 2022

16th July 2022

26th August 2022

28th August 2022

2nd September 2022

10th September 2022

- 32. The event on the 28th August 2022 took place in the beer garden of the premises and was excessively loud. The band playing had speakers facing towards the boundary with Ynysderw Road, which is a breach of the licence condition 12. A photograph of the set-up was taken.
- 33. It is the opinion of the Officers of The Environmental Health Team that the structure and location of this premises is not suitable for the type of entertainment the licensee wishes to provide. Due to the fact that the premises is surrounded on two sides by residential properties the closest being approximately 4m from the boundary of the premises. I understand that the inhabitants of this house purchased the land from the pub to make a driveway.
- 34. When considering the combination of: the poor sound attenuation of the structure of the building; the inadequate controls that management have implemented; the poor attitude shown towards the advice and recommendations, and the continuing noise nuisance that the premises is causing: the Officers have reached the conclusion that the premises is not suitable, or appropriate for live or recorded music to be provided in this manner. The managers or supervisors at the premises have demonstrated that they are unable to provide such entertainment; without giving rise to complaints, and more significantly, officers of the department have witnessed the excessive noise in person, on several occasions.
- 35. Local residents have advised that the patrons of the premises are causing noise disturbance outside the premises after 23:00 hours, the premises has licensed hours of 01:00hours for service of alcohol with closing at 01.30hours. Patrons are likely to have a substantial amount of alcohol during a "night out" that finishes at this hour, and as a result their behaviour and voices are likely to be less controlled than they would usually be, if they were not under the influence of alcohol, it is known that alcohol relaxes the inhibitions. As a result; some residents report that there are often people hanging round outside shouting and talking loudly, causing them to be woken late at night, beyond the night-time hours cut off point of 23;00 hours.

- 36. In addition to this; residents have reported that patrons are granted entry after 23.00 hours. In breach of the licence condition.
- 37. There are concerns from numerous local residents that foot traffic between the licensed premises in the area is causing late night disturbance with residents regularly being woken by intoxicated persons travelling between the venues.
- 38. Pontardawe is described by the Town Council as a rural town. The town centre is very small, with Herbert Street and High Street being the main Central Business District. There are 7 licensed premises concentrated in a small area, mostly with a late licensed hour of 01.00 hours, closing at 01.30 hours. This is particularly significant, due to the fact that residential premises are in immediate proximity to these licensed premises. The town centre is not removed from residential premises, like other town centres near-by, such as Swansea and Neath, due to the fact that Pontardawe is so small.
- 39. Traditionally the pubs in Pontardawe that are woven into the residential community would not have been live music venues, with late licenses of 01:00-01:30. Pontardawe has a significantly high percentage of older residents and working families; who do not benefit from the disturbance caused by the disturbance brought in by the night-time economy.
- 40. In the opinion of Officers of the Environmental Health Team consideration must be given to the fact that having 7 licensed premises permitted to remain open until 01:30am, in a small rural town; will cause there to be intrusive and unacceptable late night disturbance and public nuisance.
- 41. Taking all the information into consideration, Officers of the Environmental Health Section, make the following recommendations:

42. Condition 1

By virtue of S177 (A) the Licensing Act 2003 the conditions of the Premises Licence relating to regulated entertainment shall be in force between 8.00 hours and 23.00 hours.

43. Condition 2

There shall be no external amplified sound in the external areas of the premises, including the beer garden and car park.

44. Condition 3

There shall be no regulated entertainment in the form of live or recorded music at the premises until such time that the licence holder and/or owner of the premises commissions an independent acoustic consultant to undertake a Noise Impact Assessment and the recommended control measures contained within the assessment are implemented. A copy of the Noise Impact Assessment along with supporting evidence that the requirements have been complied with shall be provided to the Local Authority for written approval prior to the commencement of regulated entertainment.

To comply with the above the following criteria must be met;

- 45. The report must be carried out by an acoustic consultant who shall be a member of the Association of Noise Consultants and a member of the Institute of Acoustics.
- 46. The methodology for the noise assessment shall accord with current UK guidance and British Standards and agreed with the Local Authority in advance of the assessment commencing.
- 47. Prior to implementation of the control measures the Local Authority shall be given the opportunity to review and comment on the Noise Impact Assessment and its recommendations.

48. Condition 4

Once this has been submitted and approved by the Officers in The Environmental Health Team: The Premises Licence Holder or a nominated person shall carry out proactive noise observations outside the premises at least once an hour during the provision of regulated entertainment, and take any necessary remedial action.

49. A written record of proactive external noise assessments and, where applicable, remedial actions taken shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days from the date of the last entry in the record and this record shall be available for inspection on demand by authorised council officers at all times the premises are open.

50. Condition 5

Once the Noise Impact Assessment has been submitted and approved by the Officers in The Environmental Health Team: Speakers shall not be located in the entrance and exit of the premises, or outside the building.

51. Condition 6

Once the Noise Impact Assessment has been submitted and approved by the Officers in The Environmental Health Team:

All windows and external doors shall be kept closed at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.

52. Condition 7

The terminal hour for the sale and serving of alcohol at the premises shall be 23:00 with a 30 minute drinking up time.

The premises is to be cleared of all customers by 23:30.

53. Should the permitted hours for the serving of alcohol and closing the premises fail to allow the patrons to disperse in time for the night-time hours of 23:00 hours: the closing time of the premises should be reduced, due to the proximity of residential premises.

54. Condition 8

Once the Noise Impact Assessment has been submitted and approved by the Officers in The Environmental Health Team:

A Noise Management Plan shall be submitted for examination and approval by the Officers of the Local Authority. The management plan shall identify the sources of noise associated with these premises, and detail the controls to be implemented to reduce the noise to an acceptable level.

The control measures stipulated within the management plan shall be implemented at all times whilst the premises is operating.

Operating Schedule Conditions

66. Provide prominent signs throughout the premises and at all exits requesting patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner so as to minimise impact on local residents.

- 67. Ensure that all windows and doors are kept closed whilst amplified music is being played.
- 68. The Designated Premises Supervisor or a nominated responsible person must ensure that adequate provision has been made to enable, in the event of any emergency the safe evacuation of disabled as well as able bodied persons.
- 69. Provide a sound limitation device which is operational whenever amplified music is being played.
- 70. A documented procedure must be in place to verify the age of person who appear to be under eighteen years of age to prevent them gaining access to the premises and or purchasing alcohol. The means of verification should be restricted to:-
 - (1) Accredited Proof of Age Scheme's e.g Portman, Validate
 - (2) Photocard driving licence or passport.
- 71. The following entertainment is not permitted:-

Any live performance or live display of nudity, which is of such a nature that it must reasonably be assumed to be provided solely or principally for the purposes of sexually stimulating any member of the audience (whether by verbal or other means)

- 72. The licence holder may apply for a maximum of 12 special events per calendar year.
 - a) At least 10 days prior to the event, notification must be given to the Licensing Authority and the Police in writing.
 - b) Any police objection must be received by the Licence Holder before the end of the second working day following the day on which the notice was served. In the event of a police objection, the event shall not proceed.
 - c) All conditions specified in Annex 1, 2 & 3 of the premises licence remain valid during special events.
 - d) 9 of the special events referred to above will be permitted to last a maximum of 1 day (24 hours) and will be restricted to licensable activities indoors.

e) 3 of the special events referred to above will be permitted to last a maximum of 5 consecutive days (120 hours) and will allow all licensable activities (except supply of alcohol) to take place in the outside areas i.e. beer garden, children's play area and car park. No live or recorded music will be permitted to take place in the outside areas between the hours of 11pm and 8am.

Conditions imposed at Committee

- 73. Only plastic glasses are to be used in the beer garden and the area will be supervised by staff .
- 74. Committee 16/08/2021
- 75. The outside bar (as identified on the plan attached to the licence) shall not be permitted to sell alcohol between the hours of 9:00pm and 7:59am;
- 76. Prominent signs will be erected in the outside beer garden, requesting patrons to keep noise levels to a minimum and leave in a quiet and orderly manner, so as to minimise impact on local residents;
- 77. A digital CCTV system shall be installed, or existing system maintained, at the Premises which will be operational at all times when the Premises is open to the public, and be capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, particularly facial identification. The CCTV recordings must be retained for a period of thirty one (31) days, and made available for viewing by the Police of an authorised officer of the Council on request:

The system must provide coverage of the following areas:

- i. The exterior perimeter of the Premises;
- ii. The entrance(s) and exit(s) of the Premises;
- iii. All public areas of the Premises (with the exception of the toilets).
- 78. Authorised officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay following a lawful request;
- 79. Every Friday and Saturday night, the Sunday night preceding any public holiday, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and Good Friday, a minimum of two (2) SIA registered door supervisors will be on duty from 9:00pm until closing time;

- 80. At all other times, the Premises Licence Holder will risk assess the need for door supervisors and provide door supervision between such times and in such numbers as is required by the risk assessment. They shall also display their SIA licence in a reflective armband whilst on duty;
- 81. A daily register of security personnel will be maintained. The register shall show the name, address and licence number of each door supervisor, and the dates and times that they operate. The register must be kept available for inspection by the Police an authorised officer of the Council;
- 82. A Challenge 25 policy will apply and Proof of Age will be required from any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years who attempts to purchase or consume alcohol. This means of verification should be a form of identification which bears their photograph, date of birth, and a holographic mark and should be restricted to:
 - i. P.A.S.S. Accredited Proof of Age Schemes e.g. Citizen Card;
 - ii. Proof GB;
 - iii. Photo card driving licence or passport.
- 83. Premises to keep up to date records of staff training in respect of age related sales, in written or electronic format, available for inspection on request by any authorised officer of the Council or Police.
- 84. A log shall be kept, detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The log should include the date and time of the refused sale, and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The log shall be available for inspection at the Premises by the Police or an authorised officer of the Council at all times whilst the Premises is open.
- 85. The manager and/or staff shall manage the outdoor areas to ensure that customers of the Premises do not behave in a noisy, rowdy or offensive manner, and measures are put in place for staff to monitor the outdoor areas on a regular basis.
- 86. No speakers for amplification of music shall be placed on the outside of the Premises facing Ynysderw Road and Francis Street.
- 87. No entry or re-entry to the Premises after 11:00pm.
- 88. All customers exiting the Premises shall be encouraged to exit via the double gates.

Environmental Health Statement

- 1. The Environmental Health Section of Neath Port Talbot Council wish to make an application to review the Premises Licence for Live Lounge 9 Ynysderw Road Pontardawe SA9 4EG (Premises Licence Number: PREM-0322).
- 2. The Environmental Health review application primarily focuses on the failure to promote 'The Prevention of Public Nuisance' Licensing Objective.
- 3. The decision to make the review application has not been taken lightly; but it is felt that this is the only remaining option to achieve compliance, and attain ongoing protection for the local residents from excessive noise arising from activities at, and in the vicinity of the licensed premises: causing Public Nuisance.
- 4. Issues in relation to the premises have been ongoing for a number of years. Several attempts to resolve concerns amicably with the licence holders but these have failed, and Abatement Notices has been served due to the ongoing regular nuisance emanating from the premises. Environmental Health Officers have attempted to work with the premises to reach a solution that suits all parties.
- 5. The Premises License Holders are HD Pub Investments Ltd and are the registered owners of the premises with The Land Registry. The management of the premises is overseen by Hans Andrei Dionisio Erive; as the Designated Premises Supervisor and Andrew Davies; the Manager.
- 6. Noise Abatement Notices have been served on the PLH, DPS and Andrew Davies, on 15th September 2022.
- 7. Having reviewed the history of complaints in relation to the premises; initially there has been a pattern of short term compliance following Local Authority intervention, but complaints would be received again. The management controls that are in place are inadequate for the type of entertainment they are providing in a building that is not suitably constructed to contain electronically amplified rock music, played at high volume.
- 8. The building was formerly the Royal British Legion Club. The entertainment provided in these types of premises is historically darts, dominoes, bingo, a party for a special occasion: Mostly low volume activities that do not require the building to be suitably constructed for sound attenuation.
- 9. The community Facebook Page has shown there to be a section of the community who are not sympathetic to the residents who are being affected. A number of comments have been made along the lines of: if you don't want the noise of a pub; don't buy a house next to a pub. It must be considered however; that many of the residents living in Ynysderw Road and Francis Street have lived in their homes a long time, e.g. 30 and 40 years before the premises became a live music venue. The premises has evolved into a venue that is unsuited to the location; surrounded on 2 sides by residential premises in extremely close proximity.

- 10. Complaints in 2021 regarding noise from the premises commenced almost as soon as the premises opened and Premises Licence Holder after Covid restrictions within the hospitality sector were relaxed. Environmental Health received complaints of excessive noise from music emanating from the premises.
- 11. An application was made by the PLH for a minor variation for the provision of an outdoor bar and entertainment on the car park. Objections were made due to Environmental Health Officer having concern for Public Nuisance to be caused.
- 12. An announced visit to the premises was made by Environmental Health, Licensing and Police Licensing on the 15th July 2021 to discuss the application for the variation of the Premises Licence, noise complaints and Covid controls. The premises was represented by Robert Megson. During this visit Rachel Matthews of The Environmental Health Team, discussed that music levels needed to be to be quieter due to the location of the pub in a residential area.
- 13. Mr Megson explained that he had carried out work to sound proof the rear function room, by having ceiling tiles, triple glazing to the right hand side of the function room, and had sealed gaps in the structure of the building. Unfortunately the specifications of the sound reduction of these materials was unknown. The remaining left hand side of the function room with the windows facing Francis Street, and diagonally across to Ynysderw Road; does not have triple glazed windows. There are also a significant amount of areas in the construction of the building that allow the noise inside to escape, adversely affecting the residents.
- 14. In addition; Rachel Matthews advised that there were concerns over the disturbance caused by the presence of people outside the premises, until late, i.e. 01.00hours.
- 15. HD Pub Investments Ltd, the DPS and the Manager have been notified on several occasions of the public nuisance that is emanating from, and in the vicinity of; the Live Lounge premises.
- 16. Letters were sent in October 2021 and November 2021 and again in March 2022 advising that complaints continue.
- 17. A meeting on 5th May was held with representatives of the premises: Hans Erive Dionsio and Andrew Davies with Environmental Health Officers: Gareth Liley and Rachel Matthews. Mr Liley advised the representatives that the control measures that they stated they were carrying out: measuring with a sound meter, installation of ceiling tiles, foam filler, triple glazed windows to the right hand side of the function room were insufficient to prevent a nuisance.
- 18. Documents with specifications of sound reduction of the materials used were unavailable and the management controls proposed such as; use of the hand held sound level meter were being misunderstood. In addition the sound level meter was not of the scientific grade and was not calibrated by an accredited laboratory.

- 19. The representatives were advised that they needed to have the premises assessed by an Acoustic Consultant, registered with the Institute of Acoustics, and any assessment to be carried out was to be approved with the Environmental Health Department.
- 20. The representatives were advised that until this had been successfully completed; they should not continue to provide music entertainment that causes a nuisance.
- 21. Complaints about disturbance from loud music have continued, as well as complaints about patrons causing late night disturbance.
- 22. In addition to the meetings with company representatives: Letters and emails have been written to the PLH, and the DPS advising them of these complaints and that monitoring results will contribute to consideration of enforcement action:

- 23. In response to this situation; Environmental Health Officers have carried out a noise monitoring programme, to ascertain if the complaints are valid. Witness statements from 6 Environmental Health Officers have reported that a public nuisance has been caused emanating from these premises. The Officers were deployed over the spring and summer months and have reported that nuisance occurred on approximately 7 occasions. The nuisance is comprised of excessively loud electronically amplified music, usually with drums, electric guitars and singing, and usually lasts for approximately 2 hours. The Officers have not been present for all events, due to staffing issues, but on those occasions where they have been present; nuisance has been witnessed. Making the primary concern for The Environmental Health Team being repeated, excessively loud music emanating from the premises; this relates to indoor and outdoor music, on any day from Friday or Saturday night to Sunday afternoon/ evening:
- 24. Officers of the Environmental Health Team have provided witness statements that evidence nuisance being caused on: (dates)

- 25. The event on the 28th August 2022 took place in the beer garden of the premises and was excessively loud. The band playing had speakers facing towards the boundary with Ynysderw Road, which is a breach of the licence condition 12. A photograph of the set-up was taken.
- 26. It is the opinion of the Officers of The Environmental Health Team that the structure and location of this premises is not suitable for the type of entertainment the licensee wishes to provide. Due to the fact that the premises is surrounded on two sides by residential properties the closest being approximately 4m from the boundary of the premises. I understand that the inhabitants of this house purchased the land from the pub to make a driveway.
- 27. When considering the combination of: the poor sound attenuation of the structure of the building; the inadequate controls that management have implemented; the poor attitude shown towards the advice and recommendations, and the continuing noise nuisance that the premises is causing: the Officers have reached the conclusion that the premises is not suitable, or appropriate for live or recorded music to be provided in this manner. The managers or supervisors at the premises have demonstrated that they are unable to provide such entertainment; without giving rise to complaints, and more significantly, officers of the department have witnessed the excessive noise in person, on several occasions.
- 28. Local residents have advised that the patrons of the premises are causing noise disturbance outside the premises after 23:00 hours, the premises has licensed hours of 01:00hours for service of alcohol with closing at 01.30hours. Patrons are likely to have a substantial amount of alcohol during a "night out" that finishes at this hour, and as a result their behaviour and voices are likely to be less controlled than they would usually be, if they were not under the influence of alcohol, it is known that alcohol relaxes the inhibitions. As a result; some residents report that there are often people hanging round outside shouting and talking loudly, causing them to be woken late at night, beyond the night-time hours cut off point of 23;00 hours.
- 29. In addition to this; residents have reported that patrons are granted entry after 23.00 hours. In breach of the licence condition.
- 30. There are concerns from numerous local residents that foot traffic between the licensed premises in the area is causing late night disturbance with residents regularly being woken by intoxicated persons travelling between the venues.
- 31. Pontardawe is described by the Town Council as a rural town. The town centre is very small, with Herbert Street and High Street being the main Central Business District. There are 7 licensed premises concentrated in a small area, mostly with a late licensed hour of 01.00 hours, closing at 01.30 hours. This is particularly significant, due to the fact that residential premises are in immediate proximity to these licensed premises. The town centre is not removed from residential premises, like other town centres near-by, such as Swansea and Neath, due to the fact that Pontardawe is so small.
- 32. Traditionally the pubs in Pontardawe that are woven into the residential community would not have been live music venues, with late licenses of 01:00-01:30. Pontardawe has a

- significantly high percentage of older residents and working families; who do not benefit from the disturbance caused by the disturbance brought in by the night-time economy.
- 33. In the opinion of Officers of the Environmental Health Team consideration must be given to the fact that having 7 licensed premises permitted to remain open until 01:30am, in a small rural town; will cause there to be intrusive and unacceptable late night disturbance and public nuisance.
- 34. Taking all the information into consideration, Officers of the Environmental Health Section, make the following recommendations:

Condition 1

By virtue of S177 (A) the Licensing Act 2003 the conditions of the Premises Licence relating to regulated entertainment shall be in force between 8.00 hours and 23.00 hours.

Condition 2

There shall be no external amplified sound in the external areas of the premises, including the beer garden and car park.

Condition 3

There shall be no regulated entertainment in the form of live or recorded music at the premises until such time that the licence holder and/or owner of the premises commissions an independent acoustic consultant to undertake a Noise Impact Assessment and the recommended control measures contained within the assessment are implemented. A copy of the Noise Impact Assessment along with supporting evidence that the requirements have been complied with shall be provided to the Local Authority for written approval prior to the commencement of regulated entertainment.

To comply with the above the following criteria must be met;

- The report must be carried out by an acoustic consultant who shall be a member of the Association of Noise Consultants and a member of the Institute of Acoustics.
- The methodology for the noise assessment shall accord with current UK guidance and British Standards and agreed with the Local Authority in advance of the assessment commencing.
- Prior to implementation of the control measures the Local Authority shall be given the opportunity to review and comment on the Noise Impact Assessment and its recommendations.

Condition 4

Once this has been submitted and approved by the Officers in The Environmental Health Team: The Premises Licence Holder or a nominated person shall carry out proactive noise observations outside the premises at least once an hour during the provision of regulated entertainment, and take any necessary remedial action.

A written record of proactive external noise assessments and, where applicable, remedial actions taken shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days from the date of the last entry in the record and this record shall be available for inspection on demand by authorised council officers at all times the premises are open.

Condition 5

Once the Noise Impact Assessment has been submitted and approved by the Officers in The Environmental Health Team:

Speakers shall not be located in the entrance and exit of the premises, or outside the building.

Condition 6

Once the Noise Impact Assessment has been submitted and approved by the Officers in The Environmental Health Team:

All windows and external doors shall be kept closed at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.

Condition 7

The terminal hour for the sale and serving of alcohol at the premises shall be 23:00 with a 30 minute drinking up time.

The premises is to be cleared of all customers by 23:30.

Should the permitted hours for the serving of alcohol and closing the premises fail to allow the patrons to disperse in time for the night-time hours of 23:00 hours: the closing time of the premises should be reduced, due to the proximity of residential premises.

Condition 8

Once the Noise Impact Assessment has been submitted and approved by the Officers in The Environmental Health Team:

A Noise Management Plan shall be submitted for examination and approval by the Officers of the Local Authority. The management plan shall identify the sources of noise associated with these premises, and detail the controls to be implemented to reduce the noise to an acceptable level.

The control measures stipulated within the management plan shall be implemented at all times whilst the premises is operating.

Additional information provided by: Rachel Matthews, Environmental Health Officer, Neath Port Talbot CBC.

This document is a brief summary of evidence gathered in relation to Live Lounge Public House 9 Ynysderw Road leading to the service of an Abatement Notice and the Application for the review of the licence.

History:

Our historic database goes back to 2003:

- 1) A person living close by (resident A) reported that the pub was having live music in the rear function room; this being a breach of their licence conditions. In response to this a letter was sent to the licensee: Andrew Davies, notifying them of noise complaint.
- 2003: complaint regarding the same issues was also lodged.
 Resident A also complained about late night patron noise; causing them to be woken up as people left the premises.
- 3) 2004: a different person (Resident B) made a complaint about loud music, a letter was sent to the licensee and diary sheets were sent to the person to complete; but the resident later advised the summer ended and he was then able to cope more with the music.
- 4) 2004: a further different person complained (Resident C) about excessive loud music over the festival weekend. A letter was sent to the licensee.
- 5) 2006: A further complaint was received from a different person (Resident D) and a telephone call was made by the officer to the licensee (still Mr Davies) that a complaint about loud music had been received.
- 6) 2008: A new person complained: Resident E about live music going on until 23.30pm. The licensee (Mr Davies) was telephoned and informed but he said that the music was not loud, and it went off at 23.30.
- 7) 2008: 3 separate anonymous complaints came in; our team had a policy of not investigating anonymous complaints.
- 8) 2010: Resident A reported a further complaint advising that people leaving the pub around midnight had disturbed them.
- 9) 2011: Resident A then reported further disturbance from loud music, a letter was sent to the licensee.
- 10) 2011 A further Resident: F reported disturbance from loud music, a letter was sent.
- 11) 2013 Resident F complained again about loud music.
- 12) 2015 Another Resident: G living further away, complained about loud music
- 13) 2015 Resident H a further person living further away complained about loud music

- 14) 2016 Anonymous complaint was received about loud music
- 15) 2016 Resident F complained again about loud music
- 16) 2016 An additional Resident: H- further away reported loud music. Letter sent to Mr Davies to advise.
- 17) 2016 Anonymous complaint received about loud music
- 18) 2017 Resident A made a complaint about loud music in the beer garden. A letter was sent to the licensee.
- 19) 2018 anonymous complaint received about loud music
- 20) 2018 Another Resident I- complained about loud music
- 21) 2019 Resident I- made a second complaint about loud music
- 22) 2019 Resident I made a third complaint about loud music
- 23) 2020 An additional Resident: J- made a complaint about loud music
- 24) 2020 Resident I- made a fourth complaint about loud music
- 25) 2021 Resident A- made complaint- loud music
- 26) June 2021 Application for Minor Variation Environmental Health Officer Objected.
- 27) 2021 Resident I: made a fifth complaint about loud music
- 28) OCTOBER: LETTER SENT to HD Pub Investments Ltd and to DPS Mr H Erive
- 29) 2021 Resident I: made a sixth complaint about loud music
- 30) NOVEMBER: LETTER SENT TO HD Pub Investments LTd and to DPS: Mr H Erive
- 31) 2022 Resident A :complaint: loud music
- 32) 21st MARCH: LETTER SENT TO HD Pub Investments and DPS: Hans Erive
- 33) 2022 Resident A :complaint loud music
- 34) 2022 Resident I: Complaint loud music
- 35) 5th May MEETING WITH DPS and The Manager: Andrew Davies. Explained that complaints were increasing and the music style and volume was not suited to the venue and location.

Asked for Acoustic Consultant Report to assess the suitability of the building, and what works were required.

- 37) 20th May 2022: Environmental Health Officer witnessed intrusive loud music in residents premises.

- 46) Gave them the opportunity to have the festival without causing nuisance
- 47) 5th AUGUST: LETTER SENT ADVISING NOT TO CAUSE NUIASNCE AT FESTIVAL OR ANY OTHER TIME
- 48) 2022 Resident K further from the pub complained about excessively loud music at the festival from the beer garden
- 49) 26th August 2022 Environmental Health Officer Witnessed loud intrusive music in residents' premises
- 50) 28th August 2022Environmental Health Officer witnessed loud intrusive music from live music in the beer garden; in residents' premises
- 51) In response: Environmental Health Officer attended the premises to ask the person in charge to turn down the music. Person was Linda Pritchard who said: all other pubs are having music today why are you picking on us? I don't see what the problem is for us to have live music; the Officer advised that it was a warm sunny Sunday of a Bank Holiday weekend and it was extremely loud in residents' gardens and houses. The volume of the music was not switched down.
- 52) 2nd September 2022 Environmental Health Officer witnessed loud intrusive music in residents' premises

- 53) 10th September 2022 Environmental Health Officer witnessed loud intrusive music in residents' premises in the bedroom of Resident I where they were able to hear a selection of Meatloaf songs between approximately 20.30 and 21.30.
- 54) 10th September 2022 LETTERS SENT: advising Loud music
- 55) 15th September: Service of Abatement Notice and Application for Licence Review
- 56) 1st October 2022 Environmental Health Officer witnessed loud intrusive music in residents' front living room until approximately 21.20.

In summary: Intrusive loud music was witnessed in the residential street, attended Resident C's home to monitor. Sat in front sitting room and was able to hear what the songs were that were playing, bass guitar, drums, and vocals of a male singer: Blink 182, All the small things. Ryan put on his own music on his phone as background and was able to hear the music from the live lounge over his phone music.

- 57) 10th October: LETTERS SENT advising of intrusive loud music.
- 58) October: 4 Environmental Health Officers attended Live Lounge by agreement with Andrew Davies to observe the monitoring exercise carried out for the Acoustic Consultant Report that we requested on 5th May 2022.
- 59) These Officers were selected as they had all submitted Witness statements to me regarding excessive loud music witnessed in residents' homes over the last few months.
- 60) The noise inside the premises appeared to be excessively loud and was reaching 100dB on the measuring tool on the bar. My colleague: Simon Evans observed that the Sound Level Meter used by the acoustic consultant was reading a similar level: around 3dB difference.
- 61) In my opinion the music inside the bar was uncomfortably loud on the ears. My colleagues were positioned in the homes of the residents who were willing to take part in the exercise: Resident A, C, J. All complainants and Environmental Health Officers were in agreement that the level of music being played for the assessment was not at the level they had previously witnessed.
- 62) Officers advised the Acoustic Consultant that we felt that this was not a true representation of what we have previously experienced, but the Consultant was accepting that he had sufficient volume levels to use in his assessment.
- 63) In my opinion the building is not constructed to reduce the noise level from the music being played at the volume the licensee's desire.
- 64) We have not had any specifications of acoustic properties of the ceiling tiles; installed by Robert Megson, or double glazed windows. There are many pathways in the structure and fittings: the side doors are improperly fitting, there is a ventilation grill and a flue stack; these will all provide noise break out routes.

- 65) To provide the style of entertainment the licensees want: which is high volume rock music; the building must be properly sound proofed to reduce noise breakout, or; they music must be played at a significantly lower volume to prevent public nuisance.
- 66) In response to the application for the Review of The Licence A total of 6 residents have come forward and given personal impact statements explaining why they are opposed to the activities at the premises. These residents representing their households; in most cases 4 persons inhabiting that household; have come forward to give personal impact statements on how these circumstances have affected them.
- 67) The residents who have supplied a personal impact statement are: Resident A, Resident C, Resident F, Resident J, Resident L, Resident M.
- 68) Residents have requested to be kept anonymous as they are intimidated by the online harassment they have experienced, which they have shown me photos of and can be provided.
- 69) There are many online comments in a petition that are quite aggressive and threatening.
- 70) Some videos have also been viewed that show disturbance from patrons of the pubs in the area in the street outside their homes, that the residents may wish to exhibit.
- 71) From the statements given by residents who wish to come forward to oppose the live music being played at this volume in the pub; statements such as:

It has got louder and louder

It has become more frequent; 3 times per weekend

It used to be just the festival, which they would concede and cope with

The residents no longer wish to tolerate the disturbance, at the volume and regularity it occurs as it is intruding into their homes and gardens.

- 72) The Environmental Health Officers have witnessed the disturbance and have acted with appropriate enforcement action.
- 73) The Council has a duty to act on the evidence provided to prevent the residents from suffering further Public Nuisance. As we are able to see; this has been going on for a long time, and has gathered momentum with more resident complaints and more frequent episodes of disturbances.
- 74) The demographics of the area are of concern. There is a significant number of older residents and families residing in the streets adjacent to the premises. There are a significant number of households that have moved into these houses, in the last few years. These residents are unlikely to be benefitting from the activities at the pub. Some people who live in the vicinity have come forward in support of the pub, but that does not reduce the impact the pub is having on others.

- 75) A resident who was a prolific complainant has stated they have sold their house and moved because of the disturbance.
- 76) An email was received on 14th October 2022 from the Acoustic Consultant employed by the Live Lounge owners stating:

"From the measurement taken once your team had deemed the noise level from music subjectively acceptable in a nearby garden, we have a design noise level of 44.7 dB(A).

Our advice will work to this, as far as feasible, and structurally practicable"

A company can hold a premises licence it does not have to be to applied to an individual, however every premises must designated a premises supervisor who generally has day to day control of the premises.

I can confirm the premises cannot currently sell alcohol outside, as it is not included on their licence.

The licence holders are looking at varying their licence to include this area however we have not yet received a complete application to do this as yet, I am expecting this application will be submitted shortly.

When this application has been formally submitted you will see a blue notice go up on the premises and you can then submit representations against the proposal.

There is no additional licence required to show live television, other than the usual television licence.

I am aware of the resident who made this compliant regarding his son being woken up and I met with the designated supervisor to discuss this matter. Beyond the immediate area surrounding the licensed premises the control that a licence-holder can exert over its patrons diminishes and individuals who engage in anti-social behaviour are accountable in their own right. However, licence holders should consider the actions they may take as a responsible licence-holder to mitigate the potential impact of patrons. In this instance advice was sought to make sure that their door supervisors where outside at closing time to try and limit any unnecessary noise disturbance. Regards

After an interesting number of weeks since my last response from you a number of issues have arisen, which I believe responses from both Licensing and Planning.

You provided me with the details of the holders are HD PUB INVESTMENTS LTD. I have always believed that he licensee should be a person/s not a corporate body. Can you please confirm if there is human in charge of there should be a person who is responsible for the operation of the pub and must ensure the rules are being followed?

You state they are not permitted to serve alcohol from any "outside bar" as this is not allowed under the terms of the existing premises licence; the new owners have been informed of this. If they wish to carry out this activity they would have to vary their licence and you would then have an opportunity to object and address the licensing committee at a hearing as you have done previously. The following day The Other Place installed wooden boards to close off this area. However on most Thurs- Sunday evenings the boards are removed and this area is being used. The Other Place is now actively advertising their external bar area on their Facebook pages. Can you please confirm that this is an unauthorised bar and must be shut and that no applications has been submitted to allow this area to be used.

On several occasions customers of The Other Place have been shouting loudly while using the external seating areas or that the large screen TV which has been installed is turned to very loud creating a disturbance. Can you confirm that there is no requirement to hold a separate licence to play a large screen TV in the car park?

Also customers on leaving the premises in groups or individuals, have been responsible for excessive noise while moving down Ynysderw Road, Francis Street or into other parts of Pontardawe. A resident went to the staff of The Other Place to raise that a small children had been awoken by the noise and had been disturbed by them. He was informed "as soon as they have eft the premises they are not their responsibility so Tough!" Obviously I have amended their language! Can you confirm that a licensee retains responsibility for the customers both on and off the premises.

Gareth Jones is on leave at the moment and I see you have been dealing with him previously so I will replay on his behalf.

An application to transfer this premises was received on 22nd April 2021 to have immediate effect. The new licence holders are HD PUB INVESTMENTS LTD.

As far as the licence is concerned they are not permitted to serve alcohol from any "outside bar" as this is not allowed under the terms of the existing premises licence; the new owners have been informed of this. If they wish to carry out this activity they would have to vary their licence and you would then have an opportunity to object and address the licensing committee at a hearing as you have done previously.

There are conditions attached to the licence as you have mentioned i.e. sound limitation devices, ensure all windows and doors are closed etc. which will remain in force under the new owners.

When a licence is transferred all the activities, times and conditions are transferred with it so any previous restrictions that were in place under the old regime would still be in place now. If the new owners which to change any of these then they would have to apply to vary their licence which you can submit representations against.

I have forwarded your below email on to Environmental Health and the Police for their consideration. Other licensed premises do have restrictions on the use of the beer garden but as you know all licenses have to be treated separately.

As this is an application to vary your licence consideration should be given to the variation only i.e. the sale of alcohol from the outside bar. As customers can already consume alcohol outside this can't really be a consideration for this variation application unless you decide to volunteer a closing time yourself.

The control measures will have to be very robust to ensure customers using the beer garden until late at night do not cause a nuisance as residents are so close.

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

Good afternoon Peter

Further to our consultation response regarding the above, we have received the noise management plan and feel that the control measures are insufficient to make the proposal acceptable.

The document is too generic and lacks the relevant detail to reassure us that noise can be adequately controlled.

- What does the document mean by noise sensitive areas? It should be clear to the staff tasked with
 monitoring where they are expected to monitor and what they are assessing. It would be usual to require
 that noise is not audible 1m from the façade of the nearest residential property, but in putting this in the
 noise management plan the applicant must be satisfied that they can achieve it.
- 2. How regularly will outdoor areas and noise sensitive areas be patrolled? We would usually expect this done hourly as a minimum, for the findings to be recorded and where noise is detected, or the potential for noise, action should be taken immediately and this action should also be recorded. This information should be retained for a relevant period of time (e.g. 1 month)
- 3. How does the applicant propose to enforce the "no re-entry" rule? There are two gates, the large double gates into the former carpark and the smaller gate to the left of those gates. How do they propose that staff will monitor both gates and carry out all of the checks required on outside areas and monitor at noise sensitive areas?
- 4. Patron noise from customers in the beer garden and leaving the premises has been a major source of complaints during covid and we need to better understand how this will be addressed. Are additional door supervisors proposed? As previously stated there would be a lot of areas to monitor and one door supervisor would not be able to manage all of the tasks within the current noise management plan.
- 5. It would be useful to understand how frequently the applicant proposes to have live music/entertainment in the outside areas, as the more frequent it is the more likely it is to cause a disturbance.
- 6. Do they propose to have regulated entertainment (i.e. speakers playing music outside), if so what times will this take place?
- 7. We recommend that complaints are recorded and a record is kept of any action taken in response to them .
- 8. Consideration should be given to the appropriate location for any live music acts in external areas and any controls that can be used to minimise the impact of noise from them in addition to the direction of speakers. In cases where the applicant is not in control of the volume of music i.e. if a band brings their own equipment they must ensure that they discuss noise levels with them prior to the event taking place.

The following comments relate to the noise management plan as a whole and will touch on elements that are outside of this variation (i.e. to do with the internal areas), however, it seems prudent to raise them now.

- 9. The line "Live music to finish at 2300hrs 2100hrs on a Sunday" is unclear, and whilst we can assume they mean 2300hrs Mon Sat unless it is stipulated clearly the document will not be easily enforced.
- 10. The licence conditions require a sound limitation device to be in operation when amplified music is being played. This is not included in the noise management plan and it should be along with the levels at which the limiter has been set and maintained. Other such controls should be included like access to the limiter by staff.

As you are aware an EHO recently witnessed very loud music from the premises, in light of the fact that the licence holder had been notified of complaints and visited by EH, Licensing and the Licensing Police this causes us concern that they do not have control of noise issues at the premises. It is likely that if noise complaints continue EH will be submitting an application to review the premises licence, as such the noise management plan should be a robust working document that sets clear expectations to all members of staff at the premises and it must be enforced at all times.

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The Other Place

Environmental Health have received several complaints about The Other Place, Pontardawe and most noticeably since Covid most complaints have related to loud noise from patrons and music in the beer garden.

An interim procedure was in place during Covid whereby Licensing would investigate complaints to establish whether the complaints were a breach of the Licence or of Covid regulations and as such these complaints were referred to the Licensing team for investigation.

Environmental Health has remained in contact with them throughout the investigation to offer advice and support regarding noise.

Following receipt of the application being discussed today to vary the licence, Environmental Health raised objections on the grounds of inadequate information to demonstrate that licensing objective of for "prevention of public nuisance" would be achieved.

At the request of the applicant Rachel Matthews, Environmental Health Officer attended a meeting at the premises with Licensing to discuss how they could address our concerns. Following that visit a noise management plan was submitted but Environmental Health.

I have reviewed the document and am not satisfied that the proposed controls are sufficient to mitigate the impact of noise on surrounding residential properties.

It is also worth noting that since the meeting with Rachel Matthews an Environmental Health Officer has witnessed very loud music from a live band

within the premises that was audible in the Lidl and Bypass Carparks within his car. It was also audible at the complainant's property.

Of particular note to this application are the EHO's comments in relation to noise after the band finished. He reported the following;

"The music noise quietened down after 10pm – background music from inside could still be heard in Francis St, but it was at a much lower volume than when the band was playing. Noise from patrons noticeably increased at this time as they spilled outside after the band finished due to increased numbers outside and people talking very loudly after being inside with such a loud band."

This demonstrates that the current controls are insufficient and the new Noise Management Plan doe not appear to offer any additional controls or actions to those already in place which relies principally on staff monitoring of noise in outside areas. The applicant has been provided with detailed feedback regarding the Noise Management Plan.

Finally it should be noted that on the basis of numerous complaints and the noise witnessed by the EHO on the 31st July 2021, Environmental Health are considering making an application to review the premises licence for The Other Place to address the failure to prevent the public nuisance licensing objective.

With regard to this application to vary the licence, as always it would be our preference to receive adequate information up front as this enables us to recommend clear conditions that could form part of the licence, however, if committee is minded to approve the application we recommend that a condition requiring the submission and approval of a noise management prior to the use of the outside bar is essential.

Whilst I was in Ponty on Saturday night I also visited The Other Place.

There was a band playing in the rear room, and it was very loud — I could hear music noise when parked in the Bypass car park when I first got to Ponty, and a couple of hours later I parked in Lidl's and it was loud enough for me to identify the song at that distance ("Anarchy in the UK" in case you wanted to know!).

I visited the complainant twice at approximately 2100-21:15 and 22:00-22:25 and although I didn't enter the house to monitor the noise, it was very loud at the front door when the band was playing and almost certainly would have been audible in the front living room and bedroom.

The structure of the rear bar did not appear to be particularly effective at resisting the passage of the music noise, and there appeared to be increased breakout on the Francis St elevation close to the fire escape and through two large air vents close to the stage.

I also observed a lot of cars trying to find parking spaces in Ynisderw Rd and Francis St, which Mr Melen had been a real issue since the marquees were erected on the car park.

I also observed a number of patrons entering the rear bar through the exit of the one way system (and I was able to do it myself unchallenged) as there was a door supervisor on the entrance door only.

The music noise quietened down after 10pm – background music from inside could still be heard in Francis St, but it was at a much lower volume than when the band was playing. Noise from patrons noticeably increased at this time as they spilled outside after the band finished due to increased numbers outside and people talking very loudly after being inside with such a loud band.

Further to our meeting on the 4th May 2022, I would like to confirm the content of our discussions.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the ongoing issues in relation to the noise breakout from the rear function room; in particular the noise of music and singing from performers.

It is acknowledged that you have implemented some controls at the property; namely undertaking noise measurements within the function room and outside, and the installation of ceiling tiles.

You identified the installation of the ceiling tiles as a control measure, however, you were not aware of the sound insulation that the installed tiles provide. It was evident that no expert acoustic advice was sort prior to installation.

In terms of your noise measurements, you suggested that you have previously been advised by an Environmental Health Officer of target noise levels; but unfortunately, you were unable to identify the officer. It is not common practice for Environmental Health Officers to provide generic noise target levels in such circumstances, and it would be useful if you are able to identify the officer who you believe suggested the noise targets.

Typically we would advise to rely on subjective assessment, as objective noise measurements can be complex and can lead to a misunderstanding of the impact. The complex nature of noise measurements and the potential variants were briefly discussed during the meeting.

We recognise that you have taken measures in an effort to resolve matters, but recent monitoring by our Environmental Health Officers has found that the implemented measures have not prevented a nuisance, and further actions are required. In our opinion; The primary cause of the noise breakout is due to the structure of the function room, and it is likely that structural improvements will be required if you wish to continue providing entertainment, at such a volume.

You are urged to seek professional acoustic advice from an appropriately qualified Acoustic Consultant, who is to be registered with the Association of Noise Consultants (ANC), and a member of the Institute of Acoustics (IOA). The website of both organisations provide a search function to assist in locating registered consultants.

As informed during the visit, it is now likely we will submit an application under the Licencing Act 2003 to review the Premises Licence. As part of the application, it is likely we will seek to remove the exemptions offered by the Live Music Act, and require an acoustic consultant's report along with the implementation of suitable controls prior to entertainment being provided within the rear function room.

I understand from your email on 5th May 2022 that you have been in contact with Red Twin Consultant, we are pleased that you have acted so swiftly, showing your willingness to co-operate and resolve the matters of concern.

The investigation remains open and further monitoring will continue by officers of the Authority for the purposes of the Environmental protection Act 1990 and The Licensing Act 2003.

I'm pleased to see that the proprietors of The Other Place have taken heed of our advice and sought professional assistance in relation to the noise break out from their function room. I am also pleased to see that you have made contact with us prior to undertaking any assessment or forming a proposal.

There is a long history attached to the premises and in particular the noise breakout from the rear function room. Under previous licensing regimes entertainment in the rear room was very much restricted due to the inability of the function room to contain the entertainment noise.

It is difficult to explain in words the extent of the entertainment noise emanating from the premises. I would suggest in order for you to have a full appreciation of the issue, you should undertake an announced visit to the area while entertainment is being provided; I feel this would be the only way for you to have an appreciation of the extent of noise coming from the property and the clarity of the noise. It is worth noting that we are not only dealing with an issue of low frequency coming from the building, but a wide range of the frequency spectrum. Music, instruments, and vocals all can be heard clearly at some distance away from the premises.

Clearly the volume at source is excessive for the building it is within, and the current building structure does not provide adequate sound insulation for the volume of entertainment at which the proprietors want to provide. Due to the clarity of the entertainment which can be heard outside, and at some distance away, it strongly suggests that the building is extremely poor at containing the noise. I would be very surprised if your inspection of the building does uncover some clear and significant sound transmission paths.

It is highly likely that your clients may focus on residents that they have known to raise objections in the past; we cannot Page 97

confirm the identity of complainants, however we have indicated to your client that there are a number of complaints. It is important that the assessment you undertake considers the nearest noise sensitive properties, and does not focus on properties that your client may identify to you.

In a nut shell, an assessment needs to be undertaken to assess the noise impact/break out, an investigation as to why noise is freely flowing from the premises, and subsequently an action plan as to what needs to be done in order to ensure the noise impact is reduced to an acceptable level (I envisage the action plan will contain recommended structural works, along with an operational noise management plan).

- 10. At 22:35hrs we monitored from the first floor front bedroom; audible music and continued base beat notable on entering the room. The double glazed window was slightly open to the ventilation lock.
- 11. At 22:36hrs the song and lyrics to 'Fame' was clearly audible at an intrusive level.
- 12. At 22:40hrs the song and lyrics to 'I Had The Time Of My Life' from the film Dirty Dancing was clearly audible at an intrusive level.
- 13. At 22:42hrs the window was closed and I observed the music and base of the song 'I Had The Time Of My Life', which, remained intrusive although the lyrics were not so clear but remained to intrude and affect the environment of the bedroom.
- 14. At 22:45hrs the song 'What a Feeling' was clearly audible at an intrusive level; window remained closed.
- 15. At 22:50hrs we left the complainants property. The sound level on the street was significant and could be heard some distance beyond the venue. The song by Jon Bon Jovi 'Living on a Prayer' was observed, followed by a song with lyrics to 'Some Girl'.

My observation and evidence gathered at the complainants property while monitoring the premises 'The Other Place' would count to a statutory nuisance as the volume of the music emanating from the premises was determined to be unreasonable and considerably interfered with the use and enjoyment of the complainants home.
- 17. On the 9th April 2022, a pro-active visit was again undertaken to investigate the allegations of excessive noise arising from the premises 'The Other Place'.
- 18. At 22:17hrs I arrived at Ynisderw Road, Pontardawe. At a distance of approximately 45 meters away from the premises 'The Other Place', I could clearly hear amplified music with the song and lyrics to 'Play That Funky Music' and increasing in volume as I approached the complainant's property.
- 19. At 22:19hrs along with my colleague Mr Callum Lewis, Environmental Health Officer, we arrived at the complainant's property and monitored from the front living room.
- 20. Between 22:19hrs and 22:31hrs, while having a conversation between those present, music and singing was clearly audible within the complainants property.
- 21. At 22:36hrs the sound level within the complainants property changed and it was evident the music being played at the premises had stopped.
- 22. On both leaving the complainants property and passing through the residential area of Ynisderw Road, Pontardawe, it was evident the change in volume highlighted how incongruous to the area the level of noise was.

I entered the home of one of the persons who had recently and historically complained to our Department about the noise disturbance from the pub: Ynysderw Road inhabited by Mr Nigel Pugh and his family. I sat in Mr Pugh's living room where the music from 9 Ynysderw Road was loud enough for me to be able to hear what song was being played, with the doors and windows closed. At 17.10 the first song I noted was: Smoke on The Water. I was able to hear the lyrics to the song of the chorus and the guitar strumming. It was a warm sunny Sunday afternoon of a Bank Holiday Weekend and it would be reasonable for the occupiers to expect to be relaxing within the comfort of their home and garden.								
Mr Pugh and I had a long conversation about the impact of the premises on his and his family's life. He informed me that the music played at the venue is extremely loud and regular; he advised that he is regularly affected when there is live music present on the premises. During our conversation the music continued at the same volume, but as I was talking with Mr Pugh; I did not write down what all the songs were. At 17.19 I noted that the song by The Cranberries: Zombie was being played. It was loud enough for me to recognise the chorus: "Oh Oh OhIn your head with their tanks and their bombs" etc.

Having been to visit one another residents about a different matter, I returned to Mr Pugh's house at approximately 17.59. The music from Live Lounge of 9 Ynysderw Road was continuing. I went into to Mr Pugh's rear garden. The rear garden is very attractively designed and maintained with pot plants, an attractive patio surface and a sitting area with patio lounging furniture and dining table, and in addition: a small bistro sized table near the door where Mr and Mrs Pugh enjoy having a break with a cup of coffee. It would be fair to say that Mr Pugh and his family enjoy spending time in the garden, and often their daughters will bring their grandchildren over to play and have meals in the garden. As I was present; carrying out the monitoring one of Mr Pugh's daughters arrived and they advised they regularly have family gatherings outdoors when the weather is nice.

At 18.05 Knock knocking on heavens door came on. The music was being played so loudly that we had to raise the level of our voices so that we could clearly hear what each other was saying; we were talking at a much louder level than would be normal for a conversation between two people.

At 18.09 the next song was played which I could clearly hear the lyrics: "If I lay here....just lay here.....forget the world..." etc which is from a song named Chasing Cars by Snow Patrol.

At 18.17 I decided to visit the premises and ask the person in charge to switch the volume down, as I felt it was so unreasonable. The song that was being played contained expletives and on a sunny Sunday afternoon it was possible to hear a male voice singing: So Fucking Special, which is part of a song with the title: Creep by Radiohead.

As I entered into the car park the music was extremely loud and there was only a small number of people present; approximately 20, sitting on wooden picnic-style tables. I entered the premises and asked to speak with the Designated Premises Supervisor DPS: Hans Erive Dionsio. A female approached me who stated that she was the manager at that time, I asked where Hans or Andrew Davies: the Manager were and she said that they had gone up to the Aubrey Arms and she did not know when they would be back. I asked her to phone them and speak to them or the Premises License Holder to advise them that I had visited, and to ask the band to switch the volume of the music and singing down.

Ms Pritchard stated that she did not see why it was an issue as the Gwachel and the Rugby Club have live bands on today. I stated that this was not relevant, as the music at these premises was the music I could hear at the nearby residential premises, at present. I asked her to approach the band which she did, but the music did not reduce in volume. I approached the band myself and asked them to switch the volume down; but they said they only had 3 more songs to play and they would finish. The music was deafeningly loud and it was difficult to hold a conversation with the person who identified herself as the manager in charge at that time: Linda Pritchard. I would expect that the people sitting in the car park would struggle to hear a conversation amongst themselves. There was a few tables that were occupied with a handful of people at each table.

I stood at the boundary of the car park on Ynysderw Road and the volume of the music was as loud as it had been prior to my intervention. The band were playing "I just wanna be your lovin man" I believe this is a song by Gary Moore. I was receiving some jeering and I decided the best option would be to leave the premises. I took a photograph of the circumstances, which I now display as photograph 1. This shows that the speakers being used by the band were pointing in the general direction of Ynysderw Road, which is a breach of licence condition 12 of their premises licence.

At 18.32 I returned back to Mr Pugh's garden and I could again clearly hear the lyrics: "you make me feel like the one.....take a look at me now....." etc, which is a song called Dakota by The Stereophonics. I remained at the premises and at 18:38 I was able to hear the lyrics: " slowly fade away......start a revolution from my bed......summertime bloom.....so sally can wait.....knows its too late.. walking on by" etc which is a song by Oasis called Don't Look Back in Anger.

At approximately 18.45 the live music ended and what seemed like recorded music was audible with a drumming bass beat. It was quieter, but still audible in the rear garden of Ynysderw Road.

In my opinion the circumstances as described would constitute a Statutory Nuisance, the music and singing was loud and intrusive forcing the occupiers of the premises to listen to loud music; not of their choice, which continued for a duration of approximately 2 hours, thus preventing them from enjoying the quiet comfort of their home. It would be reasonable for the residents to expect to be able to relax peacefully in the comfort of their home: either inside or outside, on a sunny Sunday afternoon of a Bank Holiday Weekend.

The breach of the licence condition regarding the speakers, the volume of the music, the duration of the music, and

- 6. At 21:20 the music stopped & Mr Pugh commented to me that the bands usually took a break after approximately 45 minutes of playing time. I left Ynisderw Road at 21:24 to undertake another walk around the licenced premises in Pontardawe. On my walk back to Ynisderw Road, I reached the bottom of Herbert Street at 21:49 and heard live music. I climbed the steps from Herbert Street to the bypass, and identified The Other Place as the source of the music. From this location approximately 70 metres from the premises I was able to identify the song being played as "The Tide is High". I proceeded to Francis Street to confirm through the window that the band were back on stage at 21:54. By this time the band was playing "La Bamba" which was clearly audible in the street.
- 7. At 21:57 I returned to Ynisderw Road, and outside the house the song "Oh what a night" was clearly audible. Inside the Living Room the music noise was more intrusive than what I had observed in the earlier set, and more audible over my conversation with Mr Pugh. At 22:07 a song started playing which was a louder and more intrusive presence in the living room and I was able to identify it as "Video killed the Radio Star". After this song, the music remained audible over our conversation but not at a level where I could identify songs until 22:19 when the volume increased again and I could clearly recognise the song "Teenage Dirtbag". At the end of the song the music returned to a volume where it was audible over our conversation in the living room but not at a level where I could identify songs.
- 8. The live music ceased to be audible inside the house at 22:32. I left Ynisderw at 22:43 when there had been no further music for more than 10 minutes. I walked to Francis Street and confirmed by looking through the window that the band had ceased playing and were dismantling their equipment from the stage.
- 9. During our conversations, M and Mrs Pugh informed me that although it was not the loudest music noise they had experienced, what I had observed that evening was fairly typical for Friday night live music from The Other Place.
- 10. Based on the findings of this monitoring visit, I am satisfied that the volume of music noise that I witnessed emanating from The Other Place would adversely affect the occupants of surrounding residential properties, and that given the duration of the music noise witnessed and the frequency at which such music noise occurs, a Statutory Noise Nuisance was caused.

towards the premises. It was a mild September's evening and noticed the windows were closed. As I settled myself in the room I could clearly make out the entertainment from the premises, observing the song 'Local Boy In A Photograph by the artist band Stereophonics.

- 10. At 20:50hrs a new song started which was identified as Blink 182, All the Small Things and was clearly audible and intrusive in the front living room. The client and family at this time were located in the rear room sat at the table to have a meal, TV was on in the background and some conversation was taking place, little sound from the premises was observed in the rear living area.
- 11. At 20:53hrs as the client and family continued to have their meal I sat in the front living room. At this time I had background music on at a level which was comfortable for the environment and to mimic a typical and reasonable household activity. During this time, I was able to observe the music entertainment from the premises over the music I had on within the room. The song 'Free From Desire by Gala was clearly audible both lyrics and rhythm.
- 12. At 20:56hrs with our own background music continuing to play, I observed a public announcement from both a male and female performer. This swiftly moved into a new song being sung by the female performer singing 'Long Train Running' by the band Doobie Brothers.
- 13. At 21:00hrs a new song started, this time by the male vocalist, singing, 'Shut Up And Dance With Me by the artist band Fun Guns.
- 14. At 21:04hrs the vocalist changed to the female singer who performed a song by Billy Idol, 'Rebel Yell' the rhythm and lyrics again were clearly audible and intrusive over the background music I was playing.
- 15. At 21:08hrs I identified a change in song. This time the song was sung by the female vocalist with the male vocalist singing during the chorus. The song which was clearly audible was by The Cranberries 'Zombie'. At the same time I noticed the TV sound in the back room had increased as the sound level emanating from the premises was causing distraction.
- 16. At 21:13hrs a new song started which was unfamiliar to me but the lyrics were noted as 'Baby I'm ready to go from the roof top shout it out'.
- 17. At 21:16hrs the song ended and the performance halted. The change in volume highlighted the impact of the sound level from the premises having on the client's peace and enjoyment of their property.
- 18. My observation and evidence gathered at the complainants property while monitoring the premises 'The Live Lounge', I would consider to be a statutory nuisance as the volume of the music emanating from the premises was determined to be unreasonable, which, noticeably interfered with the use and enjoyment of the complainants home.

- (3) We relocated to another complainant's property where we monitored from the living room.

 The music was faintly audible, but not over the TV played at a normal level or over normal conversation however again the MC was considerably louder than the music. And I would not consider it to be a nuisance.
- (4) We conducted monitoring in relation to other licensed premises in the area, returning to the Live Lounge shortly before 22.00hrs. We drove past the Public House along Francis Street which terminates in a cul-de-sac and noticed immediately that there had been a notable increase in the volume which sounded as though it was coming from the rear room of the Live Lounge
- (5) We presented ourselves at a third complainant's property conducting monitoring from a 1st floor bedroom with all windows closed. The music was intrusive in the bedroom, even over the conversation of three adults at normal level, as previously noted, whilst the volume of the music had increased the MC announcements were even louder. At 22.07hrs we could clearly hear the MC saying "come on Peter Rees" apparently cheering someone on the dance floor. We could clearly hear "Oops Upside Your Head" by the Gap Band followed by "Do the Locomotion "by Kylie Minogue; and other musical treats. I would certainly consider the noise witnessed to be a nuisance and would consider it to be a breach of the abatement notice served, which is disappointing as prior to 22.00hrs they had demonstrated an ability to control the noise level.



Hi Rachel,

Please see notes from OOH monitoring on Friday 04/11/22 regarding the premises 'The Live Lounge', Pontardawe –

- Monitored externally approximately 20 25 meters away from premises.
- Entertainment (live band with female vocalist) commenced at 20:30hrs and was situated within the front room of the premises. Rear room showed no signs of entertainment during course of evening.
- Initial songs at start of evening were audible from monitoring position but both myself and \square were unable to identify the songs amongst the road traffic noise and bonfire night fireworks.
- Between the hours of 20:44hrs 21:15hrs several songs were clearly audible. The songs sung by the female vocalist included unique styles of John Bon Jovi Dead or alive, Aerosmith Cryin and Guns N Roses Sweet Child of Mine. During this time several other songs were audible, however, due to the unique performance they were unable to be clearly identified.
- At 20:57hrs LJ contacted a complaint. During their conversation taken place beside me, the singers vocals and rhythm of song was constant and noticeably present through the conversation.
- Following an interval break the entertainment remerged at 21:38hrs. The song sung by the same female vocalist was by ACDC Highway to Hell. At this time it was noted the background noise from road traffic and fireworks had lessoned and the entertainment had become more dominant.
- Between the time of 21:41hrs 22:26hrs various songs were clearly audible from our monitoring position, these songs included 'I love rock n roll, put another dime in the juke box baby', 'How do I get you alone', Pink 'Just like a pill', 'Maniac' (song known to me from the film American Pie The Wedding), John Bon Jovi 'You give love a bad name' (big instrumental intro), White Snake 'Here I go again on my own' (at the beginning of this song both myself and LJ noticed and witnessed the sense and sound of vibrations emanating from the sound level of the entertainment), Billy Idol 'Rebel Yell', Europe 'Final Countdown' (vocalist holding end of notes, wobbling and croaky style of voice).
- At 21:19hrs Female vocalist PA 'Thank you and good night'.
- At 22:20hrs new song began. Female vocalist singing Skunk Anansie 'Weak' (earlier, during the entertainment I remarked that the vocalist sounded like the singer Skunk Anansie and would imagine that's what they would be singing).
- At 22:26hrs song sung Journey 'Don't stop believing'.
- It was noted the second half performance was significantly more audible and prominent within the area.

Police Observations to application for a review of a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

In relation to the application for a review of a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 at the below-referred licensed premises:

An application for Review of the above premises has been submitted by the Environmental Health Section.

The application sets out the grounds for the Review and has proposed a number of conditions that they believe should be attached to the licence to assist in the promotion of the licensing objectives.

In respect of the above application to review the premises licence of Live Lounge I wish to make the following representations;

Live Lounge has been a licensed premises for many years and, until recently, was known as The Other Place. As with any licensed premises there have been calls from, and about the

premises over the years and I have reviewed these calls to assess the impact this premises has had within the local community.

The current premises licence holder, HD Pub Investments Ltd, took control of the management of the premises on 26th April 2021 and as such any searches for incidents at, and reports about the premises that I have conducted start from that date.

There have been 6 reported incidents linked to the premises, 2 of which I do not believe to be relevant to this representation.

I believe it worthwhile, at this point, to give a breakdown of the incidents reported and visits to the premises, in chronological order, which are as follows;

On 18th May 2021 a meeting was held involving the DPS, officers from local authority Licensing team and myself as part of the wider Covid re-opening visits in the Pontardawe area at which the Covid restrictions and responsibilities were discussed.

On 15th July 2021 a meeting was held with the premises management team, officers from local authority Licensing & Environmental Health (EVHD) departments and myself to discuss a licence variation application. As part of this meeting noise complaints about the premises, received by EVHD, and the ongoing Covid control measures were also discussed.

On 18th December 2021 at 22:00hrs a report was received that a customer had been assaulted by door staff at the premises. Officers attended, spoke with all parties and established that this had been a lawful ejection of 2 customers causing problems in the premises.

On 16th May 2022 at 11:03hrs a report of behaviour the previous night was received from a resident relating to possible Covid breaches and ASB with customers from the premises littering in the streets. The report stated that this had occurred the previous evening so officers were not dispatched and the matter was referred to the Joint Enforcement Team (JET) for further enquiries.

On 16th May 2022 at 12:56hrs a further complaint was received from a resident about potential Covid breaches the previous night and this matter was also referred to the JET for further contact.

On 23rd July 2022, after 21:00hrs, an enforcement visit at the premises was conducted by myself and Mr. Malough from the local authority Licensing team, at which time it was established that there were no door staff working at the premises, which constituted a breach of the premises licence condition contained in Annex 3, condition 5 which states;

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Every Friday and Saturday night, the Sunday night preceding any public holiday, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and Good Friday, a minimum of two (2) SIA registered door supervisors will be on duty from 09:00pm until closing time

This breach was pointed out to staff and was dealt with by way of a verbal warning to them on the night and it was decided that Local Authority Licensing would inform the PLH in writing of the breach.

On 22nd August 2022 at 23:00 a report of a customer being assaulted by door staff was received. Officers attended and spoke with all parties involved. On speaking with the complainant they did not wish to pursue the matter further. As a result officers decided that no checks of the CCTV were necessary as there was no complaint.

On 13th September 2022 a meeting was arranged, at the request of Mr. Erive & Mr. Davies to discuss ongoing issues with sourcing door staff for the premises to achieve compliance with their premises licence conditions and how this could be managed going forward. A complaint about customers entering the premises after 11pm was also raised with them and management of customers entering and re-entering was discussed as it was felt that this was an area that would be the responsibility of door staff when working.

At the conclusion of the meeting, while there was sympathy for the management team in sourcing door staff, it was pointed out to them that employing door staff was a requirement of their premises licence, during the times specified in the relevant condition, while licensable activities were taking place.

On Saturday 1st October 2022 a joint enforcement visit involving officers from the Security Industry Authority, local authority & police licensing was conducted and, once again, it was found that no door staff were employed in contravention of condition 5, Annex 3. On this occasion this was pointed out to Mr. Davies and it was decided that I should send a letter to both the Managing Director of HD Pub Investments Ltd and to the DPS Mr. Erive informing them of what we had found, which I have done.

As you can see from the incidents listed above Live Lounge, during the tenureship of HD Pub Investments Ltd, is not a premises that appears to attract a high volume of calls relating to Crime & Disorder.

The above information is submitted for your information and consideration.

An application for Review of the above premises has been submitted by the Environmental Health Section.

The application sets out the grounds for the Review and has proposed a number of conditions that they believe should be attached to the licence to assist in the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This application primarily relates to the prevention of public nuisance and outlines that the premises is not suitable, or appropriate for live or recorded music to be provided until appropriate control measures are put in place.

The premises licence has been in place for many years and was transferred to HD Pub Investments Ltd in April 2021.

On reviewing our complaints logs I can confirm 11 complaints have been made from August 2010 to August 2022.

The complaints have come from residents and the Environmental Health Section.

You will note that 9 of these complaints were from 2021 onwards, details outlined below:-

- 17th August 2010 Music being played in function room Resident
- 28th March 2011 Excessive noise as a result of live music being played Resident
- 10th May 2021 Noise form customers outside, bar being used in external area TV loud -Resident
- 17th May 2021 Music playing outside until midnight, customers shouting and swearing Resident
- 17th May 2021 Premises playing loud music until 00.15 on Saturday night. Customers swearing and shouting Resident
- 20th July Loud music and general customer disturbance from 20:45 on Friday 16th July -Resident
- 8th November 2021 Noise form bands from 7pm on a Sunday Environmental Health
- 21st March 2022 Noise complaints from premises over the weekend Environmental Health
- 27th May 2022 Environmental Health Officers have witnessed music emanating from the above premises
- 20th August 2022– Noise complaints following festival weekend Residents
- 23rd August 2022 Complaint alleging various dates in July and August where noise nuisance has occurred allegation premises breaching licence conditions

As the Review application states I have been involved in a number meetings with the licence holders, Designated Premises Supervisor and area manager to deal with the matters reported above.

In regard to the conditions proposed within the Review application I am aware the licence holders have already engaged with a consultant and I would hope by the time this application is put before the committee this process would have been completed.

I would say the licence holders are under no obligation to obtain a noise impact assessment unless the conditions proposed in the Review are approved by the Licensing Sub Committee, however it's positive that this work has started and wasn't disputed.

As there has already been engagement with the noise assessment company this suggests that the premises licence holder recognises improvements are required and hopefully the noise impact assessment will address many of the concerns raised in the application in regard to noise nuisance.

There are a number of conditions attached to the premises licence that deal with the prevention of public nuisance however with the deregulation of live and recorded music these conditions are only enforceable after 23.00 hours.

It is mentioned in the Review that some conditions have been breached and allegations were made that customers were being allowed entry in to the premises after 11pm, this was reported by a resident and then raised with the DPS and area manager at a meeting on 13/09/2022.

In regard to the existing premises licence conditions I would add that on 23/07/2022 & 01/10/2022 the premises was visited by licensing officers and the police to carry out routine licensing visits. On both these occasions there were no SIA door supervisor present resulting in a breach of the condition outlined below:-

Every Friday and Saturday night, the Sunday night preceding any public holiday, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and Good Friday, a minimum of two (2) SIA registered door supervisors will be on duty from 09:00pm until closing time

Letters were sent to the licence holder regarding this and a meeting was had with the area manager and DPS to deal with this matter.

Section 11 of The Councils Statement of Licensing Policy outlines what it expects from premises in regard to the licensing objective Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The Policy acknowledges the key links to health and well-being from public nuisance in terms of disturbed sleep, stress caused by nuisance and pollution.

It also recommends that licensees apply a high standard of control to minimise the potential for any public nuisance that may arise from their operation of the premises, particularly where:

- they are situated in a residential or noise sensitive area; or
- extended opening hours are proposed.

The Policy recognises that the impacts of licensable activities are not contained solely within a premises building. Residents could be affected as customers travel to and from a premises or congregate outside whilst it is in operation.

It is important to clarify and this is also raised in the Policy that beyond the immediate area surrounding the licensed premises the control that a licence holder has over its customers diminishes and individuals who engage in anti-social behaviour are accountable in their own right.

Taking in to consideration the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy and the high standard of control that should be implemented, I submit this representation supporting the conditions relating to the noise impact assessment.

The application confirms 6 Environmental Health Officers have witnessed noise nuisance on 7 separate occasions and there have been numerous letters and meetings to resolve the issues outside of the Review process.

I believe the licence holders acceptance to carry out a noise assessment prior to the hearing demonstrates an understanding that this course of action is appropriate to resolve the noise issues reported.

Clearly live music is a big part of this premises and has been for many years so it is important that a balance is found where the premises and the residents can work/live together amicably. The noise impact assessment will help achieve this as it will set out how this premises can successfully provide live music without causing a noise issue.

There is also a proposal within the Review to reduce the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol from 01.00 to 23.00hrs this primarily is to deal with the alleged anti-social behaviour issues. I am unable to provide any further evidence regarding this and would suggest that the police or residents living in the vicinity are better placed to comment further on this.



Personal Impact Statement

Regarding Live Lounge

September 2022

My name is Kate Nicholson I live at 13 Ynysderw Road. I bought the house in 2003 and moved in in 2004. My elderly parents also live here with me, they are both in their eighties and we also have a young woman living with us who is a Ukrainian refugee.

When we first lived here the Live Lounge was just a pub, with no extraordinary impact on us. As you would expect when living next to a pub; there was the occasional disturbance of people leaving, or a minor fight. This is what we accept living in this location, we know what to expect. We have lived near pubs before; on the high street in Llandovery and prior to that we lived on the High Street in Pontardawe next to pubs, we know what it is like, and we are willing to accept it.

The problem we have living by the Live Lounge is that the last 10 years or so, slowly the music has got louder and louder. There used to be music on the occasional weekend, but now almost every weekend there is live music on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Our house is situated approximately 20 metres from the pub. When music is being played; in particular; live music, the volume of music in our house and garden is unbearable.

If the weather is nice it means once the bands start up I can't sit in the garden, we have to shut the windows and doors so we can't have any air flow. Even when we shut the doors and windows; we are still able to hear the music in our home. My parents like to sleep with their window open but they are unable to. They usually go to bed about 10pm, but they either have to lie awake, or wait to go to bed when the band has stopped. My father has vascular dementia and so he finds this distressing. My mother is suffering from sight loss, and she cares for my father. When the music is playing it makes it much harder to care for him, and she is unable to go to bed to rest and relax.

We have had a patio fitted so that we can eat our meals outside when the weather is good, most week days we are able to, but at weekends it is too unpleasant to do this, and so we don't. This is very upsetting, we feel this is an unreasonable impact on our lives.

This summer has been extraordinarily hot and we have had to keep the windows and doors closed when the music is on. We can still hear the music with the doors and windows closed, and even with the television on.

My family members become agitated and very, very frustrated as they can't relax in our home, and feel the volume of the music is just too loud. My guest; the Ukrainian woman, is shocked at how loud the music is.

The nature of the pub has changed, I bought the house knowing what to expect with living by a pub, but it is not just a pub, it is now a live music venue, which is not suitable for a residential street.

The impact this pub has on our lives is very stressful. For example; On a bank holiday weekend 2 years ago there was a live music event on at the pub, and the street was full of the cars of customers at the pub. They do not have a car park anymore, as they have a marquis on their car park where they have benches, a tv, and an area for bands to play. There was nowhere for me to park. We have a dropped kerb and a ramp to allow my mother access in her wheelchair. I couldn't get my mother out of the car, into the wheelchair and into the house. As there was the event on at the pub, and lots of cars I didn't recognise. I approached the owner, as he was stood outside the pub, to ask if he

would put a call out over the mic to ask the person parked over our dropped kerb, outside of our house, if they could move their car, but his attitude was very disappointing: he just looked at me and said: it's not my problem. I tried to explain about my mother and the wheelchair etc. but he just repeated: it's not my problem. This is why I haven't tried to communicate and negotiate with them since. They have made it clear they are not interested in the issues the wider community have. My other neighbours have been over to discuss the noise with them, and it has not been received well.

In the past when the music was played, I would often sit outside and listen; if it was music I liked, but now; the music is so loud it is unpleasant and not enjoyable, and so I stay inside with the doors and windows closed, even on a warm evening, which makes me very annoyed. If the weather raining there doesn't seem to be as much disturbance, and so sometimes I find myself hoping that the weather will change and start raining by about 8pm; just to make life more peaceful.

During the festival; there is no control whatsoever. The street was packed with cars, I could not turn the car round. I don't know how an emergency vehicle would get through. I organise events and I know that when you organise them, you must have these matters addressed. I am going to raise this with the relevant persons as I extremely concerned that something could go horribly wrong.

This year there was a women who went beside my caravan and urinated. I know my other neighbours have also complained about persons urinating against their fence. The facilities are not provided for toilets and parking, for an event of this scale.

The music was unbearably loud from all directions, inside our house it was awful. We have to stay in and endure it. Apparently I am supposed to go away so that the pubs can carry on as they please.

I am aware that there is a petition with hundreds people putting their names forward. It is stated that we are trying to stop music; but we are NOT trying to do that. What we want is for it to be controlled and so it doesn't have the effect on my family, as I have described. I don't want to see the pub shut, I just want them to be good neighbours; which I don't think is an unreasonable request.

We have put up with it for 10 years, and it seems that if they are given an inch; they take a mile. I simply don't understand why it has to be so loud. I haven't been inside, because I find it too loud outside so I envisage that it would be unbearable inside.

There are number of people on Social Media that say we should go away for the weekend if we don't like the noise; then I would be away every weekend. I have my mother who is wheelchair bound and suffering sight loss, my father has dementia and I have a Ukrainian refugee, all those factors would mean I would need 3 rooms, it would be unreasonable for me to do this, I am not in a financial position to afford this weekend after weekend, instead of living in my own house.

Re: the live lounge@ The Other Pace

I note there's a plan to review the Licence for The Other Place. As a close neighbour to the premises, I wish to register my concerns on this application.

I wish to firstly point out that despite a petition that has recently been circulated, I and no others in the area have requested that all Live music in Pontardawe be banned and stopped. Many of us have been, or currently, involved in live music and would never seek to its' removal from the Cultural history of Pontardawe.

I have lived here on Ynysderw Road for a little over 40 years and have a seen several changes to the use of the premises. When I moved in the premises were run by the Royal British Legion which was more a social club for an elderly clientele. While events were held, they were more sedate and did not require amplification. There followed a period of a couple years where the building was closed following the RBL move to a new venue in Pontardawe.

After a few of years of laying empty it was sold to a new owner who decided to re-open it as a Pub, but aimed at a much younger clientele. Part of this target audience he introduced a few groups to perform there.

After a couple of new licensees, Andrew Davies took over and spoke about aiming to make the pub more a family-oriented pub with food and drink. He also introduced additional groups were playing at the pub in either the main hall area or in the small front bar area.

When he applied to alter his licence for much longer opening hours, I and several other residents met with the licensing committee to highlight the impact the plan would have on us.

Following this meeting the committee agreed to some of his alterations, however they placed several restrictions on the opening hours and restrictions on both volume limits on music, live or recorded, as well that doors and windows should remain closed and where groups should play to also limit the impact on residents'.

I believed, initially, I had a good working relationship with both Andrew and his staff in. Whenever I had any complaints either noise or the behaviour of people entering or leaving the pub, I could raise it with Andrew, and he would normally act to resolve these issues. I believe that other residents had been contacting NPT and local ward Councillors to raise complaints and concerns.

However, we had a major increase in the issues residents faced during the "Ponty Summer Fest" period where several of the local public houses would hold both internal and external music stages where both bands and records would be played with excessive amplification. In fact, I'm aware that people living several miles away could hear the sound. This normal took place from lunchtime unto midnight and sometimes later.

As the Other Place used the car park as the place of holding the eternal stage and food concession vans people would use the Ynysderw Road and Francis Street as a general carpark, often blocking vehicles in their driveways or dropped footpaths for residents who were unable to walk far. On several occasions I had to report dangerous parking to the

Police on the junction of Ynysderw Rd and Francis St, as well as obstructions to the roads which prevented access for emergency vehicles and numerous keepers of vehicles had written warnings and parking tickets.

Following numerous complaints to the police, as well to NPT, eventually double yellow lines were placed on the junction of Ynysdew/Francis St. These did have a little impact on the number of vehicle parking illegally.

During the lockdown period the car park of The Other Place has placed a large, covered marquee along with "picnic benches" to allow for external drinkers. They have since built an external bar and an area for bands to play as well as a large TV to show sporting events.

Despite several reminders from the licensing Office of NPT, the Other Place continued to use this external bar, even advertising its use on Social media. After the last licensing review, it has used in reduced periods.

However, since the pub transferred to the new owners (Red Dragon Pubs,) there has been a marked deterioration in the behaviour of the Pub and its clientele (arriving and leaving) at the pub.

Previously events were held monthly, quite often on a Saturday or Sunday, though sometimes both, which were very loud. However Red Dragon now holds weekly bands on Friday and Saturday Evenings, as well as late Sunday afternoon. On the whole bands would be playing in the main hall but with window and doors open It was at excessive levels further exactified by the bass reverbing through the house. The noise levels have prevented us from sitting outside during summer months and with the temperatures in spring and summer we have been unable to open our windows to help with cooling our house.

The music can be heard inside our house even through double glazing and we are unable to enjoy or relax in our gardens because of the excessive amplification.

We have had an increase in people entering and leaving he pub, especially after closing times. People are often shouting, swearing in the area. They are also urinating against walls and in residents' gardens. This can go on till as late as 03:30 with people moving to and from other licensed premises in the area. Often there I the sound of vehicles revving engines and running for long periods.

Only during the Ponty Fest weekend there are door staff, Despite speaking to them to request that users of the pub not to be urinating off the premises. He stated he had no idea what I was referring to. This was despite me indicating 2 people standing less than 10 foot from him urinating against the wall. With the reduced parking at the Other Place users of the Pub have been parking in the area unfortunately this has been resulting issues for residents who are often unable to park on Ynysderw Road or Francis Street. Also, several of the drivers having been parking on the footpaths, completely blocking the access for people in wheelchairs or pushing buggies. This has been reported to the police. We do have n additional issue as cars may be in the Yellow Lines area, and a such the Police will not take any action as feel its an area of responsibility of NPT however enforcement officers don't cover this area and don't work after 5 or at, the weekend.

I want to reiterate that there is **no** request to ban any live music in Pontardawe, we only want to raise the issue of excessive amplified music in several Pubs. I have noticed that on the Petition that has been circulated on posts on Social Media about this it appears that residents have only started complaining about noise from the venues since August, while residents have been raising concerns for several years. Also, several people have made insulting comments about the residents, such as we should be forced out of Pontardawe, and that we should be "named and shamed" and that local businesses should stop serving

us, with one signature even stating that the residents should be burnt ("Only Joking!") In addition, I've noticed that of those who have signed both the petition or posting on Social Media are not neighbours that I recognise, or in fact live in the area surrounding the Other Place.

I hope the committee will take into account the very serious issues we, the residents of Ynysderw Road and Francis Street, have to face on most days and especially on the weekend and nights.

Personal Impact Statement A2

Live Lounge

I am A2. I live at xx Ynysderw Road. I have lived here for about 40 years. When we first moved in, the premises that is now Live Lounge was The Royal British Legion Club. They used to have the occasional party, but it was never very loud; and it finished early. The rest of the time there was just darts and dominoes and things like that. They used to be open until 11pm, and everyone was out soon after. Now and again there would be a bit of noise as someone left, but it was always early enough for it not to cause any real problem with disturbance.

Since live music is being put on at the pub; the noise in my house is unbearable. I can hear the lyrics to the music when I am sat in the living room. If I sit in the garden on a nice evening, it is like the music is on in the garden. It takes over and it is impossible to sit and enjoy the garden and sun.

The music is on most weekends, and usually for 3 evenings: Friday, Saturday, Sunday. People say that we should not be trying to close the pub down, we are not trying to do that. We just want them to have the pub properly sound proofed so that they can carry on having their entertainment, without us having to hear it in our homes. Its not unreasonable to ask for that.

The pub is now a live music venue, it is in a residential street with many elderly residents, and working people and families living here. Some people that live in the street are happy with the music being so loud, but that is up to them. Just because they are happy with it; doesn't mean the rest of us have to be.

The petition that is online has hundreds of signatures; these are not people that live in our street. Even if they were; it should not take away our right to peace and quiet. They are not putting up with this every weekend.

The pub has a licence until 1am, closing by 1.30. When people have had a night out until that time; they have usually had plenty to drink. When they come out of the pub; they are shouting and swearing, sometimes fighting. They wake me and my family up, this happens regularly. I think it is reasonable to expect to go to sleep at a reasonable time; and not be woken up every week.

When they come out of the pub, they often urinate in the street, against our garden walls, in between our cars. There is often piles of sick that we have to clean up. There are bottles smashed in the road which we have to clean up. Cars are parked all over the road, including on double yellow lines, and on the pavement. If an emergency vehicle had to go up the road it would struggle to pass.

I have tried loads of times to speak with Andrew; the manager of the pub, to ask if he can keep the music down, and keep the customers from causing so many problems. But he does not care; He just shrugs his shoulders, and everything carries on as it was, and says I ve got to make money.

I understand that businesses have to make money; but they should not do it at the cost of the neighbours nearby. All we ask is for some respect for us to live peacefully, without having music forced into our home 3 times a week.

People say why don't we go away for weekends to avoid the music if we don't like it? Are these people serious? Why should we go away from our home to allow other people to make as much noise and mess as they like, when this is our home? I wouldn't be able to afford to do that anyway. I think it is unreasonable to have to do this, just because the pub doesn't want to turn the music down.

The venue could and should resolve the issue which causes the problem. And that would sort out the correct sound proofing, that's not too much to ask? Yes it cost money but it would resolve the issue for the most part.

To whom it concerns.

I have struggled with not coming forward openly to support the revision of The Other Place due to their negligence at upholding the licensing objectives. This is because of the huge amount of intimidation that is being rallied by the licencee and the staff of the pub. There have been for many months negative slurs on social media which I find quite intimidating. Stating that there is no problem. Residents who have stood their ground, being verbally intimidated. Move. Don't live by a pub. Close your window. Moaning tw*t.

At weekends the music may stop at 11pm but the revellers can be noisy until 12.30 am (on target there they are. I will provide the cctv footage to Rachel). If there is an event on you can extend that to 3-4am. My children and others have to hear the swearing from revellers between the Other Place and the Rugby Club and vice versa. a colourful vocabulary swearbook they could write you. They were woken by a massive fight very late in the evening early hours on festival weekend. Huge group of 20 people! That is not a public nuisance.

The rubbish, glasses in your garden. Sick on the pavements.

The car park for the pub has now been turned into a beer garden since the event of the smoking ban. This in turn creates more outside noise, contributing to low level public nuisance. It has also aggravated the car parking for the pub itself. Patrons parking on pavements outside and on all of the corners/junctions around the other place even on double yellow lines. The lines are frequently ignored as was witnessed during the festival and on a football occasion (pictures can be provided by many of the neighbours). The lines are there as there is a nasty bend and if there were a fire it could result in loss of life. During the festival there were so many people using the 3 pubs at the same time the sheer amount of people walking up and down ynysderw road frequently made it difficult for a car to drive as people were walking on the road and would not move. Ticket sales would ensure the safety of people. But it's about MONEY not SAFETY not even BEER allegedly!

The licencee himself parks right outside the pub on the pavement which sets a sterling example to his customers, so why should they do any different than Andrew!

I have so much to say. I will copy (Redacted) in and ring her on Monday.

Dear Sir/Madam

I refer to the above application of 15 September 2022, submitted by R Matthews, Environmental Health, Neath Port Talbot CBC, and the associated Environmental Health statement providing supporting information.

I have lived at the above address for approximately 27 years. I am 74 years old and someone who has always recognised and abided by the rule of law. I should also state for your information that I am a patron of The Other Place, although I am not a regular music listener at the venue.

My home is approximately 60 yards, diagonally opposite from the boundary wall of The Other Place, in a northerly direction. Although there are regular music events held at The Other Place, I can categorically inform you that I have NOT been affected by excessive and audible noise from the premises AT ANY TIME. Although the windows in my home are double glazed, I can honestly declare that I have not been conscious of ANY excessive music noise, nor am I aware, or have been affected by ANY disturbances caused by people outside the premises at late hours. In part, this may be as a consequence of improvements introduced by Mr Andrew Davies (now Manager at the Other Place, but previously the owner, when he purchased the building some 18 years ago) and made the conscious decision to stop entry / exit to the premises via the door on the side of the building facing Francis Street, and move this to the opposite side of the building, facing a public road and away from any residential properties.

I have to say that as a NPTCBC ratepayer and a long standing Ynysderw Road resident, I am disappointed at the handling of this investigation by NPTCBC Environmental Health Team and some of the statements and conclusions they have arrived at. During the course of their investigation, I am not aware that they have at any time conducted a survey of all the residents in Ynysderw Road, to establish whether there is a consensus involving everyone (not just those who have complained) about noise / or disturbance. I think it is incumbent on NPTCBC Environmental Health to ensure that

there is no bias one way or another about this issue. We live in a democracy, and, as such, we all have a right to be heard and cognisance given to our views.

On that note, I was dumbfounded to read the contents of paragraph 9 in the Environmental Health statement and, moreover, to even understand its relevance to the matter under consideration. Members of the public have a right to express their views – they do so by whatever means at their disposal. What's the purpose in referring to it in the statement?

Having read the Environmental Health statement several times, I retain numerous concerns about some of the contents and what they are trying to convey to you as a Licensing Authority. One impression may be that the residential area around The Other Place is saturated with alcohol fuelled delinquents, staggering about at all hours whilst trying to hold high pitched (and unintelligible) conversations with one another — see paragraph 28. Paragraph 30 tries to paint a somewhat similar picture, and whilst I concede there may be instances of foot traffic "between venues" — I submit that this can occur almost exclusively during the Pontardawe festival on 3 days in August every year. In my opinion, it is not a regular, week day or even every week end occurrence. The inference I have drawn from this Environmental Health (EH) statement is that the issues that some (who and how many I have no idea) Ynysderw Road and Francis Street residents, is being laid solely at the door of patrons of The Other Place. It is a possibility that those causing a noise have in fact spent time (and money) in different licensed premises beforehand, specifically in either Neath or Swansea, where drinks are widely known to be considerably cheaper per unit than charged anywhere in licensed premises in Pontardawe.

The other impression I get from the EH statement is that there has seemingly been little good will from the managers and /or supervisors at The Other Place to provide entertainment without giving rise to complaints (paragraph 27). Yet there is evidence in the EH statement (paragraph 17) that the managers have made differing attempts to mitigate concerns from residents. EH state these measures "were insufficient". In paragraph 18, EH explain their reasoning as to why these attempted measures "were insufficient". It is not clear to me from the EH statement as to whether EH offered or provided The Other Place with any form of guidance that the latter could have followed, implemented and thereby "become sufficient". This is at variance with some of the (I believe draconian and punitive) conditions that EH have outlined in their statement that The Other Place now has to attain to allow entertainment, specifically condition 3.

I would like to finish my comments by expressing my concern with the message I believe I'm getting after reading paragraphs 31, 32 and 33 in the EH statement. Is the purpose of the statement to provide the Licensing Authority with pertinent and relevant information relating solely to The Other Place, or has NPTCBC EH decided unilaterally to conflate matters/issues and include all Licensing Premises in Pontardawe?

I hope that you find my comments of use to you in your deliberations.

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1. Introduction

Acoustic Consultants Limited (ACL) have been appointed to provide acoustic advice with the aim of reducing the impact of noise on nearby residential premises from recorded and live music due to live music events at The Other Place, Ynisderw Road, Pontardawe.

Noise complaints have been received from nearby dwellings to the venue and a noise abatement notice (Live/1337/RM/1) has been served on management of The Other Place, a pub owned by Red Dragon Pubs. The noise complaints and the associated abatement notice relate to live and recorded music from inside the venue only, as we understand.

ACL have undertaken an attended noise survey at the site with a live band playing within the event space of the venue. Local Authority Environmental Health Officers were also in attendance during the survey, Rachel Matthews being one, who has been ACL's point of contact to arrange the survey.

The data obtained is presented within this report along with noise control measures to aid in reducing, as far as feasible, and using best available techniques (BAT), the impact of noise at the nearby dwellings. It should be noted that noise control measures may not reduce the noise level outside of the event space to the Local Authority's criteria provided in this report, on every occasion. Our proposals therefore also include for a sound limiter to be installed within the premises to minimise this risk.

The author of this report is an Associate Member of the Institute of Acoustics (AMIOA), has four years' experience in the field of noise and is considered suitably qualified to undertake this noise impact assessment. This report has been checked by a Member of the Institute of Acoustics (MIOA) and Director of the company with over 13 years' experience in the industry.


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2. The Site

The Other Place is set in a residential road, Ynisderw Road, flanked by the A4067 to the south-east, and the A474 to the north. Road noise from the two A-roads makes up most of the ambient noise in the area. The venue is in the immediate vicinity of residential dwellings on Ynisderw Road, and Francis Street. We understand that complaints have been received from a few dwellings in these areas.

The following figure provides context of the site and surrounding area. The event space used by the pub is highlighted in yellow, and is set at the rear of the existing pub. All buildings in the streets the pub is located on are residential dwellings and are therefore classed as NSRs.







3. Local Authority Requirements

3.1. Premises License

The Other place operates under Premises License PREM-0322. This license allows operation of live and recorded music at the premises between the following hours:

Sunday to Thursday: 08:00 to 23:00 hoursFriday & Saturday: 08:00 to 01:00 hours

• New Year's Eve: Until 02:00 hours

The license states in Annex 2:

"2. Ensure that all windows and doors are kept closed whilst amplified music is being played."

"4. Provide a sound limitation device which is operational whenever amplified music is being played."

3.2. Abatement Notice

The Section 80 Abatement Notice was served on the 14th of September 2022, reference number Live/1337/RM/1, in respect of Statutory Nuisance.

The abatement notice does not give full details or clarity of the nuisance to abate or the level to abate too. However, from our discussions with the Local Authority the noise in question is from live and/or recorded music within the event space to the rear of the pub. This is the source of complaints from nearby residents.

3.3. Local Authority Agreement

Discussions and meetings have been held with Neath Port Talbot (NPT) Local Authority (LA). An online meeting was held on Wednesday the 28th of September 2022.

During the meeting, NPT informed ACL and our client that their preferred method of assessment for the noise was a subjective assessment. This was agreed upon by ACL.

It was agreed that a noise level at the nearby sensitive receivers (NSRs) would be deemed acceptable subjectively by NPT LA. The acceptable noise level forms the design noise level at the NSRs for noise control proposals.

To complete a subjective assessment, ACL proposed to attend site during a noise survey with NPT LA in attendance. Noise levels of a live band would be turned down within the venue until the levels at nearby noise sensitive receivers (NSRs) were deemed acceptable by the LA.

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During a noise survey at the site with LA in attendance on the 11^{th} of October 2022, the survey method that was agreed upon during the Teams meeting was discussed and confirmed to be carried out that evening. This entailed:

- Undertaking internal noise level measurements with the band playing at their typical level
- Carrying out external measurements around the building during typical internal music levels (for noise control design purposes)
- Turning the live band volume down inside the venue, until a subjectively acceptable level of music noise was agreed by LA at locations representative of the NSRs in the vicinity
- Once the subjective level was agreed upon by LA and ACL, a noise measurement would be carried out by ACL, at the same location as the subjective assessment. This would form the design criteria level at the façade of the NSRs

From our site survey detailed below, the design noise criteria to achieve as far as feasible, external to the NSRs is 45 dB(A).

As discussed with site management and LA, our assessment will endeavour to achieve this external noise level without hindering the operational noise levels within the venue when a band or recorded music is being played, as far as feasible.

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4. Code of Practice for Noise Control at Concerts

We would consider the noise from amplified sound from these premises to fall under the criteria for noise from concerts, subject to number of events per year. It should be noted to follow the below guidance there should be no more than **12 events per year** with amplified sound.

Guidance is given in the "Code of Practice on Environmental Noise Control at Concerts" published by the Noise Council in 1995. The document provides guidance on noise levels at the nearest noise sensitive properties in terms of the Music Noise Level (MNL). This is the equivalent noise level due to music from the venue measured over a 15 minute period.

Table 1 in Section 3.0 of the Code of Practice provides guidelines for events based on the type of venue and number of concert days per calendar year. The relevant portion of the table for the proposed site is as follows:

Table 1: Relevant Noise Criteria for Music

Concert days per calendar year, per venue	Venue Category	Guideline
1-3	Other Urban and Rural Venues	The MNL should not exceed 65 dB(A) over a 15-minute period.
4 to 12	All Venues	The MNL should not exceed the background noise level by more than 15 dB(A) over a 15-minute period.

The Music Noise Level (MNL) is defined as the A-weighted equivalent noise level determined by music and vocals during a concert and not affected by other local noise sources. The criteria above is applicable to an event until 23:00 hours.

Guideline 3.4 states that by solely assessing the noise in terms of dB(A) can underestimate the intrusiveness of low frequency noise. Consequently, the individual octave frequency bands at 65 and 125 Hertz may need to be monitored, and neither of these should exceed 70 dB.

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5. Noise Monitoring

An attended noise monitoring exercise was undertaken at the site on the 11th of October 2022. The survey was attended by Local Authority and site management.

5.1. Monitoring Procedure

A three-piece band were arranged to attend the survey. The band consisted of:

- Bass guitar and lead vocals
- Electronic drum kit
- Electric guitar and vocals

One song was chosen to play repeatedly by the band that they knew well, the song was 'I Would Walk 500 Miles', by The Proclaimers. The LA EHOs in attendance agreed with this song choice.

One fixed monitoring location was stationed within the event space. This was located centrally, at approximately 4 metres from the front of the stage and a height of 1.5 metres above the ground. The microphone was in a free-field position.

Attended measurements were undertaken within the event space; once at the beginning with the band's typical level, and once at the end with the reduced volume that resulted in a subjectively acceptable level at the façade of the NSR.

Attended measurements were also undertaken at several locations around the building with the music being played. These locations were at set and measured distances from The Other Place's building façade. Distance measurements were taken with a laser measure for accuracy. All external attended measurements were free field, at a height of 1.5 metres above the ground.

Attended measurements were undertaken within the garden of a property the LA had identified to subjectively measure from. These measurements were free field at a height of 2 metres (to clear the height of the garden wall). This location was the LA's agreed subjective assessment location, and the location deemed agreeable between ACL and LA to base the design criteria from.

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5.1.1. Measurement Locations

The following report will reference the measurement locations as provided in the following table and figure.

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5.2. Monitoring Equipment

Sound Pressure Levels were measured using an NTI XL2 sound level meter with a half-inch condenser microphone. The equipment is checked annually using a Quality System meeting the requirements of British Standard EN ISO/IEC 17025:2005 and in accordance with British Standard EN 10012:2003 and traceable to the National Standards.

This equipment was checked and calibrated as noted below and the certificates are available for inspection. Table 3 provides the equipment and calibration status.

The measurement systems were calibrated before use with the noted calibrator. The measurement systems were checked after the survey for calibration drift. A drift of 0.0dB was measured on both systems after the survey. The measured calibrations are not expected to adversely impact the measured data.

5.3. Weather Conditions

The weather conditions are as follows and are not expected to have adversely affected the measured data.

5.4.3. Subjectively Acceptable Levels

The following provides the measured external noise level of music at an NSR. The location was decided upon by the LA to assess the impact of noise subjectively. Once the level of noise was at an acceptable level confirmed by the LA, a 1-minute noise measurement was carried out at the location. This noise data forms the basis of the design criteria.

The measured octave band data obtained when the band were playing at the reduced internal level is as follows. These are the levels obtained when LA had deemed external noise levels at the NSRs acceptable.

The measured internal noise level of music to achieve the external level noted above was 84 dB(A).

5.5. Observations of Measurements

During the monitoring exercise the following observations and assessments were made:

- Existing windows facing on to Francis Street and The Other Place's smoking courtyard weak point (main transmission path)
- Building wall of event space is weak point (also a main transmission path): the walls are constructed with low density block
- Soffits of the event space are a weak point
- Roof of the event space is a weak point
- The lobbied fire doors are not fitted or sealed well
- The lobbied fire doors do not have a high enough mass to reduce noise levels
- The event space walls have several vents and flues which are creating holes in the façade

The existing external walls of the event space are not lined with any plasterboard (or similar). From our visit we consider the walls to be skimmed with plaster.

5.6. Baseline Noise Measurement

During the survey a baseline noise measurement was undertaken when the band were not playing. This was determined by road traffic. The results are tabulated below.

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6. Music Noise Control

6.1. Music Noise Limits

Following the site survey, and considering the Code of Practice, the following operational noise limits could be applied for the scheme. This considers the baseline noise climate, frequency of events and time of events, and local authority noise limits.

6.2. **<3 events per year**

Based on no more than 3 events the typical music noise level as surveyed during the site visit can be applied for up to 3 events per year, without any mitigation to the building façade and these limits can be normally achieved.

This also demonstrates that acoustic music (open-mic night style) (i.e., acoustic guitar/piano/keyboard and vocals) could be acceptable for up to 3 events per year.

6.3. **4-12 events per year**

For 4-12 events, the typical music noise level as surveyed during the site visit can be applied for up to 12 events per year, without any mitigation to the building façade and these limits can be normally achieved.

This also demonstrates that acoustic music (open-mic night style) (i.e., acoustic guitar/piano/keyboard and vocals) could be acceptable for up to 12 events per year.

6.4. **>12 events per year**

For >12 events, the internal music noise level could consist of controlled background music typically (including controlled levels of live acoustic guitar or piano for example). For any high noise generating event (such as the one measured in the survey) the building façade will need to be upgraded, this is discussed further in Section 7 below.

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² limits are also as per frequency band, as noted in Section 5.4.3 above.



7. Noise Control Measures for >12 Events per Year

The following section provides the proposed noise control measures required to control the level of noise egress from the event space, as far as feasible for more than 12 events per year.

The sections also provide the existing building fabric considered in our noise modelling, which have been calibrated to external noise level measurements noted above.

The noise control measures aim to achieve, as far as feasible, an external noise level at the NSRs due to music of 45 dB(A) at the façade of the dwellings.

7.1. Existing Building Construction

The following noise model considers the existing building fabric elements having the sound reduction indices noted in the following table.

7.2. Proposed Building Improvements

To reduce noise egress from the event space the following should be applied.

7.2.1. Existing Vents & Flues

There are several holes in the building structure from vents and flues. These must be fully closed and sealed with block (minimum density 1900 kg/m³) and mortar. This should follow the existing cavity wall, and each block should be 100mm thick each. There must be no unattenuated vents/flue holes in the building structure.

Therefore, any flues that are unable to be blocked (e.g., for the gas boiler) will require appropriate in-line attenuation installed. Any attenuators required must achieve a minimum insertion loss of 55 dB.

Please note that this is a high insertion loss requirement for such an element.

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7.2.2. Existing Windows

All existing windows in the event space must be blocked up with a high-density block (minimum 1900 kg/m³). This should follow the existing cavity wall, and each block should be 100mm thick each.

All gaps and joint work must be fully filled with mortar. There must be no gaps left in the structure. Gaps must not be filled with expanding foam.

7.2.3. Lobbied Doors

The lobbied door sets facing on to Francis Street must be upgraded. The access door sets out to the smoking area courtyard of The Other Place must also be upgraded.

The existing external lobby door set at both sides of the building must be upgraded to achieve the following sound reduction index as a minimum:

This can be achieved with a steel acoustic door set with well fitted perimeter and threshold seals.

The internal set of lobbied doors at both sides of the building must be upgraded to achieve the following:

7.2.4. **Roof**

The existing ceiling could be upgraded as follows:

- 2x 15mm plasterboard (total 25 kg/m²) [e.g., British Gypsum Soundbloc], staggered and sealed on a metal frame hung from resilient fixings from existing joists with a minimum cavity of 85mm
- 2x 15mm plasterboard (total 25 kg/m²) [e.g., British Gypsum Soundbloc] screwed directly onto underside of existing joists
- 100mm mineral wool (minimum density 10kg/m³) in top cavity between joists and existing roof

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The above construction is expected to achieve the following minimum sound reduction index.

7.2.5. External Walls

The walls could be upgraded as follows:

- 2x 15mm plasterboard (total 25 kg/m²) [e.g., British Gypsum Soundbloc], staggered and sealed on head and base tracks and a frame that is independent of the external wall
- 100mm mineral with cavity (minimum density 10kg/m³)
- 90mm metal stud at 600mm centres
- 2x 15mm plasterboard (total 25 kg/m²) [e.g., British Gypsum Soundbloc], staggered and sealed
- 50mm mineral within the cavity (minimum density 10kg/m³)

The above construction is expected to achieve the following minimum sound reduction index.

The plasterboard partition should abut the underside of the proposed plasterboard ceiling (below) and be fully sealed with a non-setting mastic (NOT FOAM).

7.2.6. **Ventilation**

As part of the Premises License, the venue is required to keep all windows and external doors closed during live or recorded music events. ACL propose to block up all windows in the event space. The lobbied doors will aid in keeping doors closed.

There must be no unattenuated ventilation measures installed in the building façade. Any ventilation measures implemented must achieve a minimum inside to outside sound reduction value of 55 dB.

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7.2.7. Noise Limiter

It cannot be guaranteed that the noise levels due to live and recorded music will meet the LA's agreed level during every event, when measured at the façade of the NSRs.

We would therefore advise that site management install a noise limiter within the event space to ensure that levels from live and recorded music do not exceed an internal level of 97 dB(A) at any time. ACL consider this internal noise level appropriate for such a venue and the typical high volume events that could be held there. The Local Authority EHOs could assist in setting the noise limiter on site once installed.

7.3. Effect of Noise Control Measures

7.3.1. Noise Modelling Parameters

The noise emission has been modelled in the noise modelling software Cadna: A by DataKustik. The modelling software calculates sound levels based on the inputted sound emission values, source and receiver locations, and primarily distance, barrier and ground attenuation. Calculations are undertaken using the General Method of Calculation from ISO 9613.

The parameters within the Cadna:A model are as follows and are considered reasonable assumptions with simplified geometry of the buildings:

- The building heights are based on site visit observations and Google Earth imagery.
- The order of reflections is 3, and all buildings are reflective.
- The ground across the site and surrounding area is considered hard and reflective.
- Topography of the site is considered flat.
- The predictions are based on the measured data provided above.
- The noise model has been calibrated to the external monitoring locations noted.
- The existing building construction has been modelled with the noted sound reduction indices above.
- The event space has been input as a radiating building at 4m high.
- Table 5, these have been input into the radiating building within the noise model.

The noise model has been calibrated to the measured levels noted above. The calibrated model can be provided upon request.

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7.3.2. **Noise Modelling Results**

The following noise map provides the predicted level due to music within the event space at ML 2, directly in front of the venue building, ML 4, the nearest dwelling to the rear of the building and ML 7, the garden that was subjectively assessed by the LA during the site survey. The noise map is calculated with the proposed building fabric upgrades noted above considered.




Figure 3: Noise Map of Predicted Noise Levels due to Music

The predicted levels across the site indicate that with good workmanship, and management of the event space, noise levels from live and recorded music can be played at a high level for more than 12 events per year and meet the local authority criteria.

7.4. Summary of Internal & Predicted External Music Noise Levels

The table below presents the predicted noise levels against the LA criteria, if only individual noise control measures were undertaken. The Local Authority agreed criteria for the music noise level (assumed to be for more than 12 Events) at the nearest dwelling should not exceed the levels in Table 7 above.

^{*} The maximum indoor level is subject to façade, ventilation and sound spectrum internally. In some cases a higher (or lower) dBA level maybe permitted and the external limits be met (not met). This is also on the basis the windows and doors are closed at all times.

These predictions are based on the data obtained of the live band during the noted survey, provided in Table 5. Frequency noise levels and overall noise levels will differ from band to band. The predicted noise levels are subject to installation, noise sources and detailing of the noted works.

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8. Summary & Conclusions

Acoustic Consultants Limited (ACL) have been appointed to provide acoustic advice with the aim of reducing the impact of noise on nearby residential premises from amplified and live music due to live music events at The Other Place, Ynisderw Road, Pontardawe.

Noise complaints have been received from nearby dwellings to the venue and a noise abatement notice (Live/1337/RM/1) has been served on management of The Other Place, a pub owned by Red Dragon Pubs. The noise complaints and the associated abatement notice relate to live and recorded music from inside the venue only, as we understand.

A noise survey has been carried out to obtain data that informs our noise modelling and advice. The details of the noise survey and monitoring locations are provided in the report. Neath Port Talbot Local Authority attended the survey to set subjectively acceptable noise levels externally to surrounding dwellings. ACL took a noise measurement in the noted location alongside LA once the EHOs had agreed upon the subjective assessment.

Following the survey this report provides noise limits based on the number of events (up to 12 per year) and other relevant guidance.

This report also provides the agreed noise limits with the local authority and noise control advice to control amplified noise to within this limit for >12 events per year where needed.

Based on the measured live band noise data, a summary is provided of predicted external noise levels against only certain structural noise control measures being undertaken and the maximum internal music noise level that is predicted to accommodate this.

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9. Detailing, Workmanship & Verification

Noise control predictions have been based on the constructions as listed in this report with no allowance made for weak points. Small weaknesses in the fabric design and/or installation are likely to significantly reduce the predicted noise control performance. Predictions are based upon the best available information with regards to the performance of the building materials and systems.

It is therefore necessary to ensure that all detailing is carefully designed so that there are no weak points present. All brick and blockwork joints should be completely infilled with mortar. It is also necessary to provide comprehensive site construction checks to ensure that the installation matches the design intent. In general terms it should also be noted that there should be no gaps in the constructions and that all components should be carefully sealed airtight using suitable dense non-setting mastics (NOT FOAM) where appropriate. All walls, unless noted otherwise, should run the full height up to the slab soffit or underside of the roof. The details at these joins will require careful consideration.

All the elements should be constructed in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.

In terms of achieving the acoustic requirements of particular elements as noted in this report, the only contractual link is between the Contractor (the Builder) and Supplier. As such, it is very important that all purchase contracts include for the particular elements to comply with the acoustic requirements as noted in this report. The verification should be in accordance with the appropriate British Standard or International Standards Organisation Standards. Weighted sound reduction indices (Rw) should be measured in accordance with British Standard EN ISO 10140-1:2010 and rated in accordance with British Standard EN ISO 717-1:2013. Sound absorption coefficients should be in accordance with ISO 354:2003 and rated in accordance with British Standard EN ISO 11654.1997.

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10. Appendix 1 – Glossary of Acoustic Terminology

A-weighted sound pressure pA – value of overall sound pressure, measured in pascals (Pa), after the electrical signal derived from a microphone has been passed through an A-weighting network.

A-weighted sound pressure level, L_{pA} - quantity of A-weighted sound pressure given by the following formula in decibels (dBA)

 $L_{pA} = 10 \log_{10} (p_A/p_0)^2$

where:

 p_A is the A-weighted sound pressure in pascals (Pa); p_0 is the reference sound pressure (20 μ Pa)

Background sound level, $L_{A90,T}$ — A-weighted sound pressure level that is exceeded by the residual sound assessment location for 90% of a given time interval, T, measured using weighting F and quoted to the nearest whole number of decibels

Break-in - noise transmission into a structure from outside.

Decibel (dB) – The decibel is the unit used to quantify sound pressure levels. The human ear has an approximately logarithmic response to acoustic pressure over a very large dynamic range (typically 20 micro-Pascals to 100 Pascals). Therefore, a logarithmic scale is used to describe sound pressure levels and also sound intensity and power levels. The logarithms are taken to base 10. Hence an increase of 10 dB in sound pressure level is equivalent to an increase by a factor of 10 in the sound pressure level (measured in Pascals). Subjectively, this increase would correspond to a doubling of the perceived loudness of sound.

Equivalent continuous A-weighted sound pressure level, $L_{Aeq,T}$ – value of the A-weighted sound pressure level in decibels of continuous steady sound that, within a specified time interval, T = t2 – t1, has the same mean-squared sound pressure as a sound that varies with time, and is given by the following equation:

Facade level – sound pressure level 1 m in front of the façade. Facade level measurements of L_{pA} are typically 1 dB to 3 dB higher than corresponding free-field measurements because of the reflection from the facade.

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Free-field level – sound pressure level away from reflecting surfaces. Measurements made 1.2 m to 1.5 m above the ground and at least 3.5 m away from other reflecting surfaces are usually regarded as free-field. To minimize the effect of reflections the measuring position has to be at least 3.5 m to the side of the reflecting surface (i.e. not 3.5 m from the reflecting surface in the direction of the source).

Octave and Third Octave Bands – The human ear is sensitive to sound over a range of frequencies between approximately 20 Hz to 20 kHz and is generally more sensitive to medium and high frequencies than to low frequencies within the range. There are many methods of describing the frequency content of a noise. The most common methods split the frequency range into defined bands, in which the mid-frequency is used as the band descriptor and in the case of octave bands is double that of the band lower. For example, two adjacent octave bands are 250 Hz and 500 Hz. Third octave bands provide a fine resolution by dividing each octave band into three bands. For example, third octave bands would be 160 Hz, 250 Hz, 315 Hz for the same 250 Hz octave band.

Sound pressure level – Sound pressure level is stated on many of the charts. It is the amplitude of the acoustic pressure fluctuations in a sound wave, fundamentally measured in Pascals (Pa), typically from 20 micro-Pascals to 100 Pascals, but commonly simplified onto the decibel scale.

Sound reduction index, R – laboratory measure of the sound insulating properties of a material or building element in a stated frequency band.

Specific sound level, $L_s = L_{Aeq,Tr}$ – equivalent continuous A-weighted sound pressure level produced by the specific sound source at the assessment location over a given reference time interval, T_r .

Structure-borne noise – audible noise caused by the vibration of elements of a structure, the source of which is within a building or structure with common elements.

Rating level, $L_{Ar,Tr}$ – Specific sound level plus any adjustment for the characteristic features of the sound.

Reverberation Time, T – The reverberation time is defined as the time taken for a noise level in an enclosed space to decay by 60 dB from a steady level once the noise source has stopped. It is measured in seconds. Often a 60 dB decay cannot be measured so the reverberation time is measured over a lesser range and corrected back to the time for a 60 dB drop assuming a constant decay rate. Common parameters are T20 (time taken for a 20 dB decay multiplied by three) and T30 (time taken for a 30 dB decay multiplied by two).

Vibration Dose Value, VDV – measure of the total vibration experienced over a specified period of time.

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Estimated Vibration Dose Value, eVDV – estimation of the total vibration experienced over a specified period of time. This is usually based on the number of events and shortened measurement data.

Weighted sound reduction index, R_w – Single-number quantity which characterizes the airborne sound insulating properties of a material or building element over a range of frequencies. The weighted sound reduction index is used to characterize the insulation of a material or product that has been measured in a laboratory (see BS EN ISO 717-1).

The following provides a summary of our Noise Abatement Acoustic Advice Report (9771-Rev A).

1. Local Authority Requirement of Noise

Prior to our report and survey, we advised that an agreement of external noise criteria was sought with the Local Authority (LA) to establish a firm base of what the design target criteria was to be.

The LA stipulated that they would want to carry out a subjective assessment of noise from a live band during a noise survey. The LA would then confirm a level that was deemed subjectively acceptable when the music noise level (MNL) was turned down within the event space.

Once the LA and ACL had agreed upon a subjective level, a noise measurement would be taken to obtain the design criteria noise level.

2. Survey & Assessment

The report details the survey undertaken in full.

The assessment undertaken provides two methods to appear the abatement notice:

- Reduce the number of events per year (in line with Code of Practice for Noise at Concerts).
- Undertake structural insulation works to the event space to allow for music as currently operating.

Reducing the number of events

By reducing the number events per year, the report indicates that the MNL could be considered to fall in line with the code of practice. However, this is a further discussion to be had with the LA.

The number of events, as set within the Code, are either 1 to 3, or 4 to 12 events per year. Our measured data shows that the venue could hold up to 12 events per year, operating as they currently are, with no structural noise control measures needed, subject to LA agreement.

The measured data, and our assessment of noise that can escape from the building, indicates that open-mic style nights could also be held for these durations with no structural works undertaken., subject to LA agreement. The agree of the property of the

A noise limiter would most likely be required to be installed within the venue.

Undertaking structural insulation works

Our measured data shows that, if the venue wished to hold more than 12 events per year, as they were measured at the noise survey (i.e., live band, playing rock music), structural insulation and noise control works would be required.

If the venue wished to play background music for more than 12 events per year, then our data suggests that this could be acceptable in terms of the Code of Practice for Noise at Concerts, subject to LA agreement.

Our full report details the specifications of structural noise control measures required to achieve effective MNL reduction.

3. Background Music

Our assessment of noise that can escape from the building, as it stands, indicates that the internal music noise level could consist of controlled background music typically (including controlled levels of live acoustic guitar or piano for example), subject to LA agreement.

For any high noise generating event (such as the one measured in the survey) the building façade will need to be upgraded as noted above and in our full report.

A noise limiter would most likely be required to be installed within the venue.

4. Partial Insulation Works

If only certain elements of the noted structural insulation works were to be undertaken, the following table provides the predicted external music noise levels, along with the maximum internal music noise levels that could accommodate this.

The Local Authority agreed criteria for the music noise level outside the building is 45dB.





Thank you for the information. I would like to make the following comments:

- 1. I query if the premises is suitable for events, it is a former British Legion Club, in very close proximity to many residential premises.
- 2. The use has evolved and intensified into providing live music, three times per week: Friday, Saturday, Sunday.
- 3. In line with the guidance referred to it is suggested that events will be restricted to 12 per year. This would still mean that 12 times per year residents who wish to relax and enjoy the peace of their homes are not able to do this once per month
- 4. The Noise Assessment Report demonstrates that a significant amount of work must be carried out in order to reduce the sound to an acceptable level; to prevent Public Nuisance.
- 5. The premises is classed as a Public House. More relevant guidance to refer to would be the Guidance for the Control of Noise from Pubs and Clubs Guidance Institute of Acoustics 2003: For premises where entertainment takes place on a regular basis music and associated sources should not be audible inside noise sensitive property at any time.
- 6. Clarification is required regarding the status of the relevant Planning Permission. The planning history indicates that there is a consent in 2006 to take in additional lands into the car park and a porch. However it was still a British Legion in 2001, and so it may not have hours/use conditions for the activities that it has been performing. The Planning Department are checking their archives.
- 7. The petition has a large number of names, but there are only a minority who have given a local postcode; most are outside the area and would not be affected by the noise in their homes, many are regional some national, and a few international. The Environmental Health Department does not intend to prevent live music in Pontardawe pubs; it only requires that residents are not disturbed, many people seem to be under the impression that we are trying to stop music, which we are not.



(1) The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of five years from the date of this permission.

To comply with the requirements of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

(2)No development shall take place until samples of the materials to be used in the construction of the external surfaces of the development hereby permitted have been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. Development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.

Reason

In the interest of the visual amenity of the area.

(3) This consent relates to the amended plans received on the 30th May 2006.

Reason

In the interests of clarity

(4) No sound amplifying equipment shall be installed, which is audible outside the premises, without the prior agreement in writing of the Local Planning Authority. Reason

In the interests of the amenity of the area.

(5) The existing and proposed beer garden together with the proposed play area shall not be used after 23:15 hours on any day.

Reason

To protect the amenities of nearby residential properties

(6)Prior to commencement of work on site, details of any proposed play equipment to be sited within the proposed play area shall be submitted to and agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority, and the equipment shall be installed in accordance with the agreed details.

Reason

In the interest of visual amentiy and to further safeguard the amenities of neighbouring occupiers.

(7)The proposed car parking area shall be laid out in accordance with the submitted details prior to commencement of use of the proposed beer garden and shall thereafter not be used for any purpose other than vehicle parking.
