Decision:

4. VEHICLE PROCUREMENT

Decision:

Report Title: Key Performance Indicators 2018/2019 – Full Year 2018-19 (1st April 2018 – 31st March 2019)

Purpose of the Report:

To report quarter 4 performance management data for the period 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019 for Street Scene and Engineering Cabinet Board. This will enable the Street Scene and Engineering Cabinet Board and Scrutiny Members to discharge their functions in relation to performance management.

Executive Summary:

A list of quarter 4 Key Performance Indicators (KPI's) with progress comments on each indicator are attached as appendix 1, these do not include those KPI's collected on an annual basis, and these will be reported in quarter 4. All KPI's with a CP reference e.g. CP/068 are Corporate Plan Key Performance Indicators. KPI's that have improved on or achieved target are GREEN (green traffic light) status, KPI's that have not achieved target but performance is within 5% are AMBER (amber traffic light) status and KPI's that are 5% or more below target are RED (red traffic light) status.

Where available, appendix 1 provides performance data for quarter 4 performance for 2016/17 and 2017/18 (6 months data) plus current year 2018/19 (six months data), and a quarter 4 target (six months target) for 2018/19.

Appendix 2 provides quarter 4 information for Compliments and Complaints data, collected in line with the <u>Council's Comments</u>, <u>Compliments & Complaints Policy</u> for Street Scene and Engineering Cabinet Board purview.

Appendices 1 and 2 are new reports from the new Corporate Performance Management System (CPMS), which went live in August 2018.

Background:

Not applicable.

Financial Impact:

The performance described in the report is being delivered against a challenging financial backdrop.

Integrated Impact Assessment:

There is no requirement to undertake an Integrated Impact Assessment as this report is for monitoring / information purposes.

Valleys Communities Impacts:

Workforce Impacts:

During 2017/18 the Environment Directorate saw a further downsizing of its workforce (by 17 employees) as it sought to deliver savings of \pounds 1,115k in the year.

Summary of Welsh Government Grant Approvals received for Highways and Transport 2019/2020

Purpose of the Report:

To inform Members of Welsh Government grant approvals received for Highway and Transport related schemes for the financial year 2019/2020.

Executive Summary:

To inform Members of the Welsh Government grant allocation for Highway and Transport related schemes for 2019/2020.

Background:

On 16th May 2019, the Welsh Government announced grant approvals received for Highway and Transport related schemes for the financial year 2018/2019 to the total value of £1,615,400.

The funding is allocated as follows:-

Safe routes in Communities (SRiC) of up to £333,000 Local Transport Fund (LTF) of up to £150,000 Active Travel Fund (ATF) of up to £319,000 Local Transport Network Fund (LTNF) of up to £330,000

Road Safety Capital (RSC) of up to £407,000 Road Safety Revenue (RSR) of up to £76,400

The schemes covered by the grants are shown in the table in Appendix A.

The grant has been accepted by the Director of Finance and the Director of Environment, who have Delegated Powers for this purpose.

Financial Impacts:

All of the funding has to be claimed in full by 30th April 2020, otherwise any unclaimed funding will no longer be available.

Integrated Impact Assessment:

There is no requirement to undertake an Integrated Impact Assessment as this report is for information purposes.

Valleys Communities Impacts:

No implications.

Workforce Impacts:

The works will be delivered using the in-house engineering design teams. There are no adverse impacts on the workforce.

Legal Impacts:

No implications.

Risk Management Impacts:

All the funding has to be claimed in full by 30th April 2020, otherwise any unclaimed funding will no longer be available.

Consultation:

There is no requirement for external consultation on this item.

It should be noted that the LTF and LTNF projects feature in the approved Local Transport Plan 2015-2020.

It should be noted that the Active Travel Routes have been identified in the Integrated Network Map.


