


• Priority Indicator 5 – The Number of Looked After Children (LAC) by Placement Type

*Social Workers' comments regarding the 2 children (for the purpose of confidentiality, referred to below as *Child 'A'* and *Child 'B'*) re-admitted into care within 12 months – March 2016:-

Child A


Child 'A's relationship with mum has broken down. Child 'A' was provided with an emergency supported lodgings placement via DEWIS however this was unsuccessful; DEWIS have no alternative placements. All other avenues have been exhausted. Child 'A' returned to the care of Mum, however upon attending a pre-arranged mediation meeting on the 31/03/16 with the Team Manager and Case Manager, Mum abandoned Child 'A' at the meeting and is refusing to them returned to her care.

Child B

Child 'B' was re-admitted to care following a number of episodes of self harm.

Child 'B' was not engaging with the community plan which involved CAMHS, who then provided a report to the department to support us in identifying the best placement and treatment for the child. A residential therapeutic placement was identified as the best placement for the child in terms of providing support to help address the difficulties in a safe and secure environment. Child 'B' agreed and signed to be accommodated and identifies the need of support. Child 'B' is currently doing well in the current placement which is reviewed on a weekly basis.


 Priority Indicator 7 – The Number of Cases held within the Service categorised by status on a quarterly basis: – Child Protection, Looked After or Child in Need




