Application for the Grant of a Premises Licence

Purpose of the Report

1. To consider representations received in respect of the following application made under the Licensing Act 2003.

Executive Summary

- 2. This is an application for the grant of a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 by Benjamin's Atlantic Spiced Rum Ltd. The premises licence will authorise the sale of alcohol off the premises only.
- Representations were received in respect of the application from South Wales Police requesting that additional conditions be attached to the licence.
- 4. The applicant has agreed to the imposition of the additional conditions and consequently all parties agree that a hearing is unnecessary; final determination of the application needs to be made by the Licensing and Gambling Acts Sub Committee.

Background

- 5. The Licensing Act 2003 requires that any person wishing to provide licensable activities obtains a premises licence from the Licensing Section.
- 6. An application for the grant of a premises licence must be advertised in the prescribed manner and allows "Responsible Authorities" or "Other Persons" to submit representations in respect of the application.
- 7. Where all parties have reached an agreement and amendments have been made to the original application, the Licensing Authority can dispense with the need for a formal hearing; a meeting of the Sub-Committee is still required to consider the amendments.

Licence Application

- 8. The applicant has included the following information in the application outlining the requested hours of operation and details on how the applicant proposes to promote the 4 licensing objectives.
- 9. Opening Hours

Monday – Sunday 08.00 hours – 22.00 hours

10. Supply of Alcohol (Off Sales)

Monday – Sunday 08.00 hours – 22.00 hours

Licensing Objectives

The following information has been provided by the applicant.

General

11. This is a newly formed company producing specialty rum products for the retail and pub trade with pure off-sales via couriers.

The prevention of crime and disorder

12. The Unit is within a security-gated industrial site which benefits from site CCTV and security patrols and an intruder alarm.

Public safety

13. Although there is no public access: Fire Exits will be kept free of obstruction and checked regularly to ensure that they are kept clear.

The prevention of public nuisance

14. No deliveries will be permitted on site between 00:00 and 06:00hrs daily.

The protection of children from harm

- 15. INTERNET SALES:
- 16. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that any person who purchases from the site shall register with the site. Such registration details shall include the person's full name, full address, date of birth and phone number. A clear document trail of the order process from order, despatch from the licensed premises and delivery to the customer is maintained (with times and signatures) and available for inspection and records shall be kept for a period of 12 months and shall be produced on demand of the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of the Council.
- 17. The terms and conditions of the company website will contain the following: -
- 18. a) The company will not sell alcohol to any person until it has been verified that the person is over 18 years of age.

- 19. b) An age confirmation requirement when registering to purchase.
- 20. c) Reference to the operating of a Challenge 25 policy.
- 21. d) That no parcels will be left by the courier if the person at the delivery address is under 18 years of age.
- 22. DELIVERIES:
- 23. The person delivering the alcohol to the premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy and shall require proof of age prior to the alcohol being handed over. No alcohol shall be handed over to a person under
- 24. The only acceptable proof of identity shall be a photographic driver's licence, a passport or an Identity Card containing the PASS Hologram. The website shall contain a declaration to this effect.

- 26. The application is to authorise the sale of alcohol off the premises.
- 27. Representations have been received from the Police requesting additional conditions be attached to the licence.
