**Empty Homes Scheme**

To seek authority from Members to:

- Allocate £240,000 of funding from the Capital Spending Programme budget for Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council's ("the Council") financial contribution toward the Welsh Government ("WG") Empty Homes Scheme.
- To request delegated authority for the Interim Head of Housing and Communities to enter into a Service Level Agreement ("SLA") with Rhondda Cynon Taf County Borough Council ("RCT CBC") to allow the authority to deliver the WGs Empty Homes Scheme and to implement any minor changes to the Scheme.

Age	x					<p>This proposal relates to the provision of grants to owners of long term empty properties, so that they are able to undertake the required works to bring them back into use.</p> <p>A person's protected characteristic will not impact on their eligibility to apply for the grant. As such, this proposal does not specifically impact on people because of their age, disability, gender reassignment status, marriage/civil partnership status, pregnancy/maternity, race, religion/belief, sex or sexual orientation.</p> <p>Bringing empty properties back into use and implementing energy efficiency improvements will have indirect positive impacts for their owners, including those with a protected characteristic(s), as quality housing has a number of positive benefits on a person's wellbeing and health.</p> <p>Some of these positive benefits may be more demonstrable for certain groups of people that have a protected characteristic by way of their age, disability or pregnancy, as set out in the Welsh Government Impact Assessment (Background Paper 2). There are no local factors that suggest that the impact on NPT communities would be different from that set out in the Welsh Government Impact Assessment in this regard.</p>


