**Wards Affected: Neath North** 

PEN Y DRE, NEATH (REVOCATION OF LIMITED WAITING, 1 HOUR, RETURN PROHIBITED WITHIN 2 HOURS, MONDAY TO SATURDAY, 8AM TO 6PM, PERMIT HOLDERS EXEMPT) ORDER 2022

# Purpose of the Report:

To consider the correspondence received following the advertisement of the Pen Y Dre, Neath (Revocation of Limited Waiting, 1 hour, Return Prohibited within 2 hours, Monday to Saturday, 8am to 6pm, Permit Holders Exempt) Order 2022, as indicated in Appendix A.

## **Executive Summary:**

The report outlines the proposed revocation of the existing traffic regulation order which was formally advertised resulting in objections being received.

#### **Background:**

The Council received representations that a vehicular dropped crossing had been installed at No.19 Pen Y Dre, Neath and the existing traffic regulation order fronting the property would need to be revoked and removed to obtain access/egress.

The revocation of the existing traffic regulation order was required to remove a Limited Waiting, 1 hour, Return Prohibited within 2 hours, Monday to Saturday, 8am to 6pm, Permit Holders Exempt parking bay directly in front of the property.

The proposed scheme is indicated in Appendix A.

## **Financial Impacts:**

The scheme is to be funded by the Council's Capital Programme.

# **Integrated Impact Assessment:**

A first stage impact assessment has been undertaken to assist the Council in discharging its legislative duties (under the Equality Act 2010, the Welsh Language Standards (No.1) Regulations 2015, the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 and the Environment (Wales) Act 2016.

The first stage assessment, attached at Appendix B, has indicated that a more in-depth assessment is not required. A summary is included below: -

A full impact assessment is not required as the revocation of the existing traffic regulation order will provide a safe environment for all highway users.

## **Legal Impacts:**

The proposal was advertised for a 21-day period in July / August 2022.

## **Risk Management Impacts:**

There are no risk management impacts associated with this report.

#### **Consultation:**

This item has been subject to external consultation.

A consultation exercise was undertaken for a period of 21-days in July / August 2022.

There were 103 letters and plans hand delivered to the properties on Pen Y Dre detailing the proposals. Following a three-week consultation exercise, 1 statement of support and 11 statements of objection were received on the proposal. A summary of the support and the objections received is given below:-

Support: - Any officer observations / comments are illustrated in italics in response to the points raised.

 A resident is fully supportive of the proposed changes to the Traffic Regulation Order.

Objections: - Any officer observations / comments are illustrated in italics in response to the points raised.

- a) Residents object to the revocation as those who pay for permits already struggle to park on the street most days.
- Residents object as parking places are oversubscribed and currently there aren't enough spaces for residents to park.
- c) Residents object to the removal of the existing Traffic Regulation Order because this will make the parking situation on the street worse.
- d) Residents object to the revocation as parking is only on one side of the street and this will affect the whole street.
- e) Residents object as parking is extremely limited and many local business and shoppers choose to park in the street rather than pay for parking in town.
- f) Residents object as even with resident permits, people are not guaranteed to park on the street.
- g) Residents object because currently there is space for about 8 cars on a road with 20 houses already limiting the space for parking.

The objections have been considered and the Council agrees that the traffic regulation order should remain in-situ due to the limited availability of parking for residents on Pen Y Dre, Neath.

The Local Members have been consulted on the feedback received and support that the objections are upheld in full and the scheme is withdrawn.

#### **Recommendations:**

Having had due regard to the integrated impact assessment it is recommended that the objections are upheld in full to the Pen Y Dre, Neath (Revocation of Limited Waiting, 1 hour, Return Prohibited within 2 hours, Monday to Saturday, 8am to 6pm, Permit Holders Exempt) Order 2022 (as detailed in Appendix A to the circulated report) and that the scheme is withdrawn.

The objectors will be informed of the decision accordingly.

## **Reasons for Proposed Decision:**

The order shall remain in place due to the limited availability of parking for residents on Pen Y Dre, Neath.

# Implementation of Decision:

The decision is proposed for implementation after the three day call in period.
