Report Title – Self-Assessment 2022-2023

Purpose of Report

- 1. To present Members with the council's draft self-assessment for 2022-2023.
- 2. The council is required to publish the self-assessment within 4 weeks of approval.

Background

- The completion of an annual self-assessment is a requirement for all local authorities in Wales. The requirement is contained in the Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act 2021 and is a corporate, organisational assessment rather than an assessment of individual services.
- 4. As part of the self-assessment, we are required to consider the extent to which the council is:
 - exercising its functions effectively (how well we are doing)
 - using its resources economically, efficiently and effectively (how do we know)
 - ensuring its governance is effective for securing the above (what and how can we do better)
- 5. As this is only the second year of the self-assessment process we have continued to work on our approach and have this year

introduced an assessment of 'Physical assets and facilities'. It is evident from having sighted other examples of completed self-assessments from across Wales, local authorities are still adopting different approaches. Many have combined the self-assessment with the annual report on the achievement of well-being objectives for 2022-2023. This approach was not adopted this year for Neath Port Talbot but is a consideration moving forward to ensure we are adding value to the process rather than duplicating.

- The report sets out how we have approached the self-assessment –
 utilising the Local Government Association Efficiency Toolkit which
 has provided a baseline enabling year on year improvement to be
 evidenced.
- 7. In undertaking this self-assessment process, in addition to stating what arrangements we have in place to ensure we are exercising our functions effectively, using our resources economically, efficiently and effective and ensuring our governance is effective, we have also considered how those arrangements can be further improved.

Conclusion:

- 8. The conclusion of the self-assessment is set out on the 'Self-Assessment Overview' on pages 18 & 19 and that Neath Port Talbot Council is identified as 'mature' when assessed against the Local Government Association Efficiency Toolkit. Whilst the rating remains the same as 2021-2022 it is felt that significant progress has been made but it will take some time for all core activity areas to be at a stage where we can progress into an overall rating of 'leading'.
- 9. As required under the Local Government & Elections (Wales) Act 2021 on 13th November 2023, the Governance and Audit Committee reviewed the draft Self-Assessment 2022-2023. The Committee made no recommendations for any changes to the conclusions or actions contained within the draft.

Integrated Impact Assessment

10. There is no requirement for an integrated impact assessment in respect of this item.

13. The completion of an annual self-assessment is a requirement contained in the Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act 2021.

- 17. To evidence how the council is meeting the duty set out in the Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act 2021, 'for each Council in Wales to keep under review the extent to which it is meeting the 'performance requirements', that is the extent to which:-
 - it is exercising its functions effectively;
 - it is using its resources economically, efficiently and effectively;
 - its governance is effective for securing the above.'

Implementation of Decision

18. The decision is proposed for implementation after the three day call in period.
